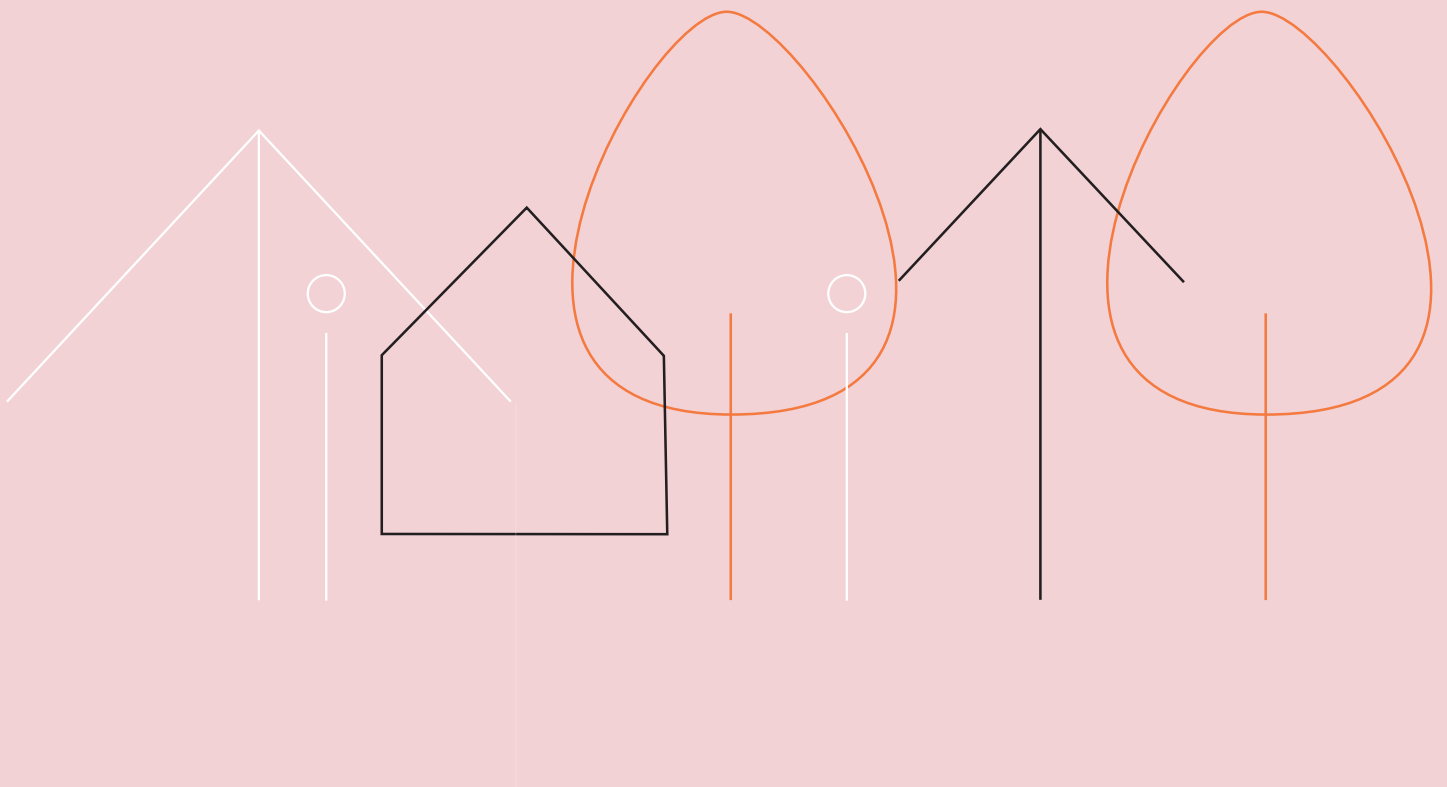

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# Estimated Resident Population (ERP)

The Estimated Resident Population is the OFFICIAL City of Port Phillip population for 2012.

Populations are counted and estimated in various ways. The most comprehensive population count available in Australia is derived from the Census of Population and Housing conducted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics every five years. However the Census count is NOT the official population of City of Port Phillip. To provide a more accurate population figure which is updated more frequently than every five years, the Australian Bureau of Statistics also produces "Estimated Resident Population" (ERP) numbers for City of Port Phillip.

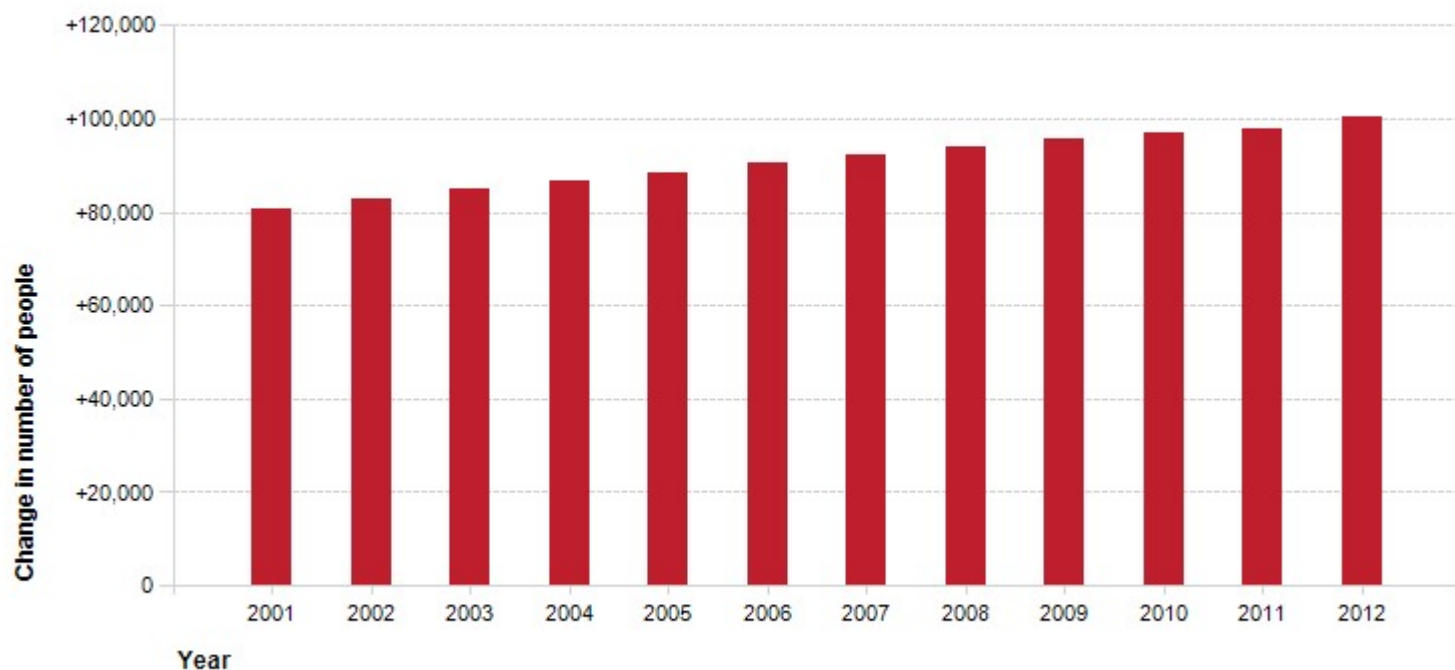

City of Port Phillip

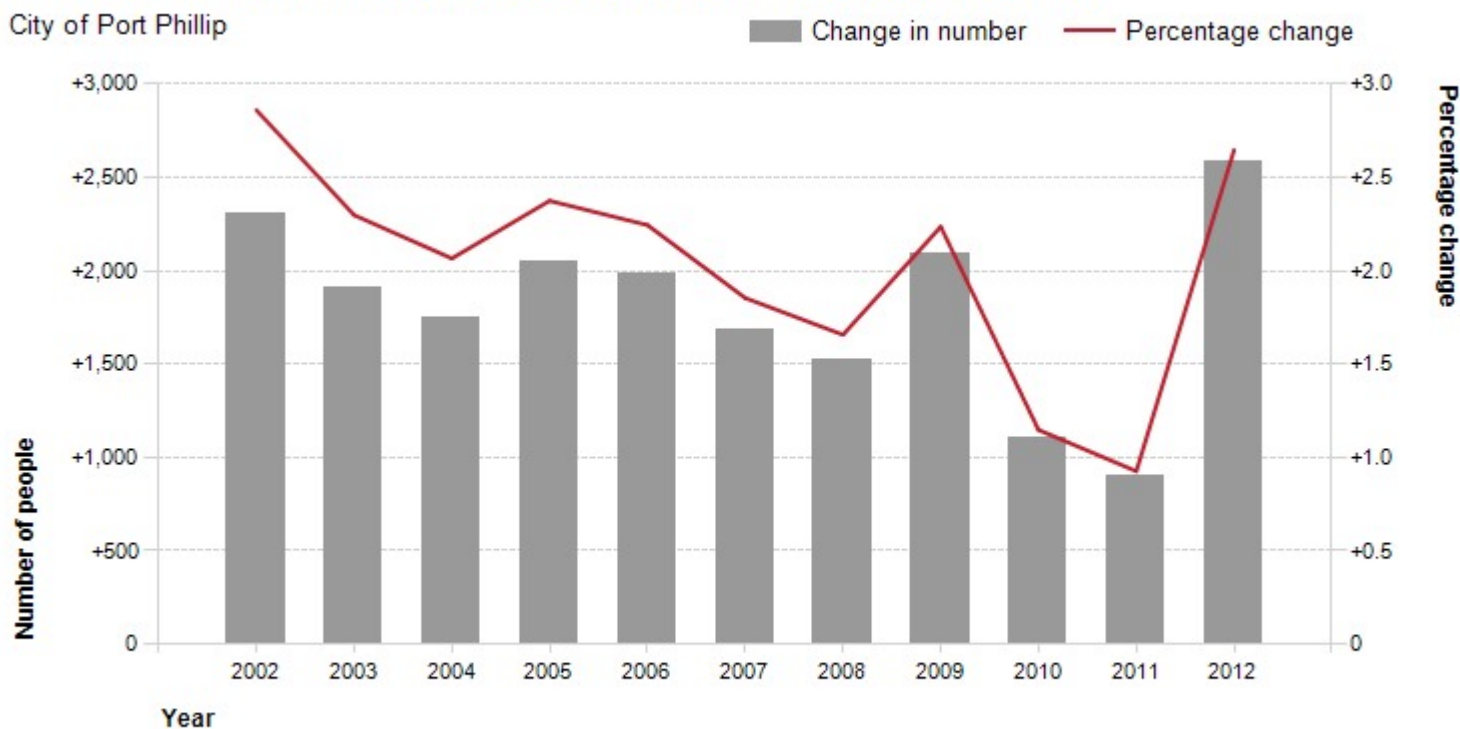

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## Annual change in Estimated Resident Population (ERP)

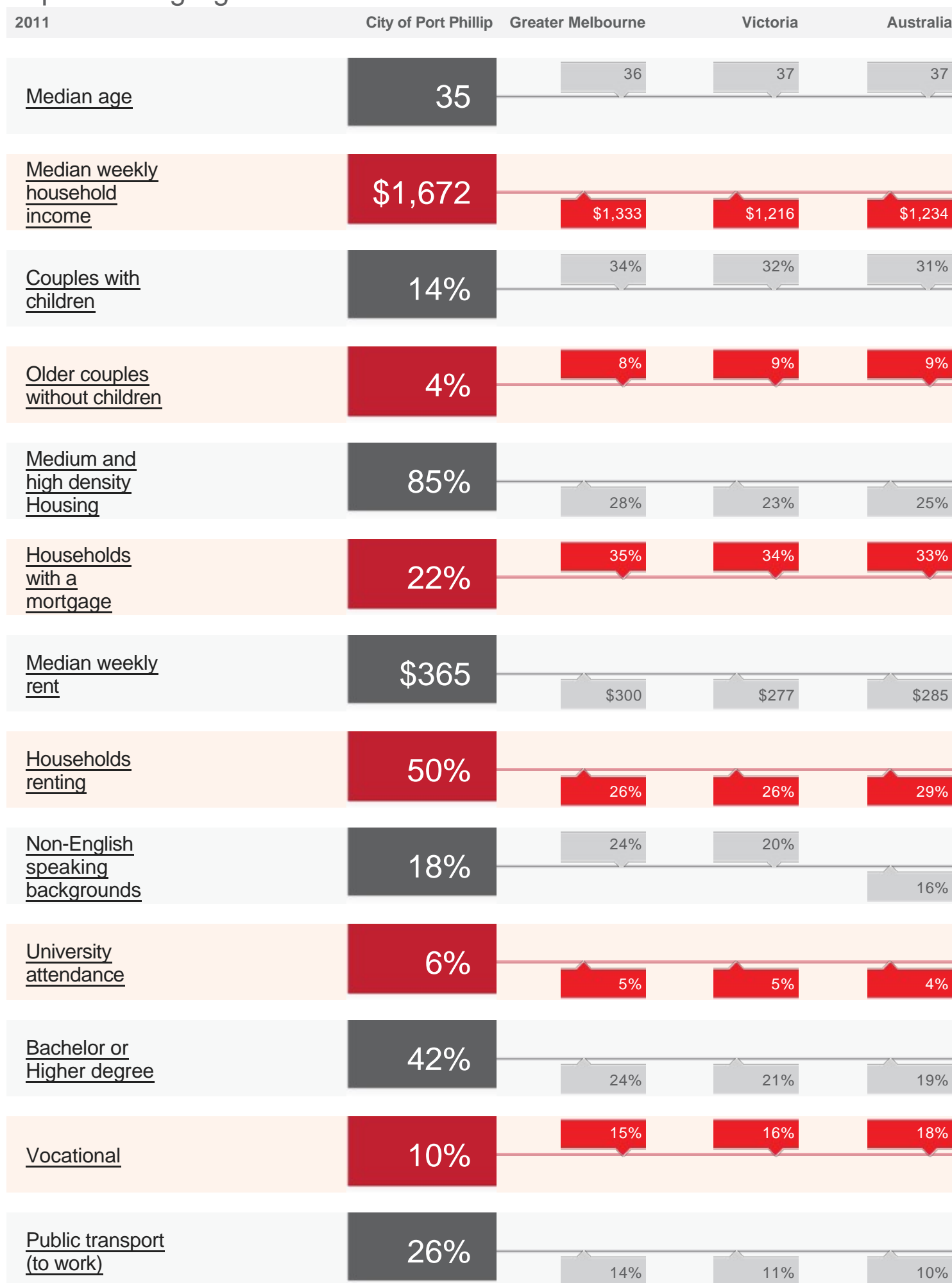

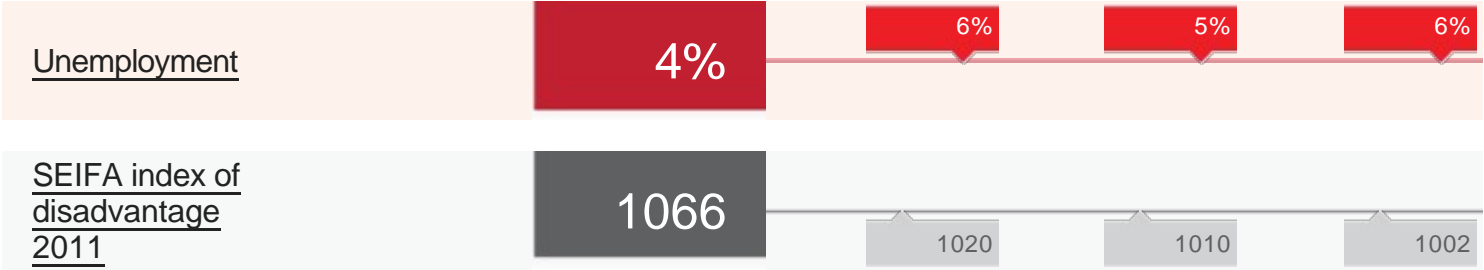

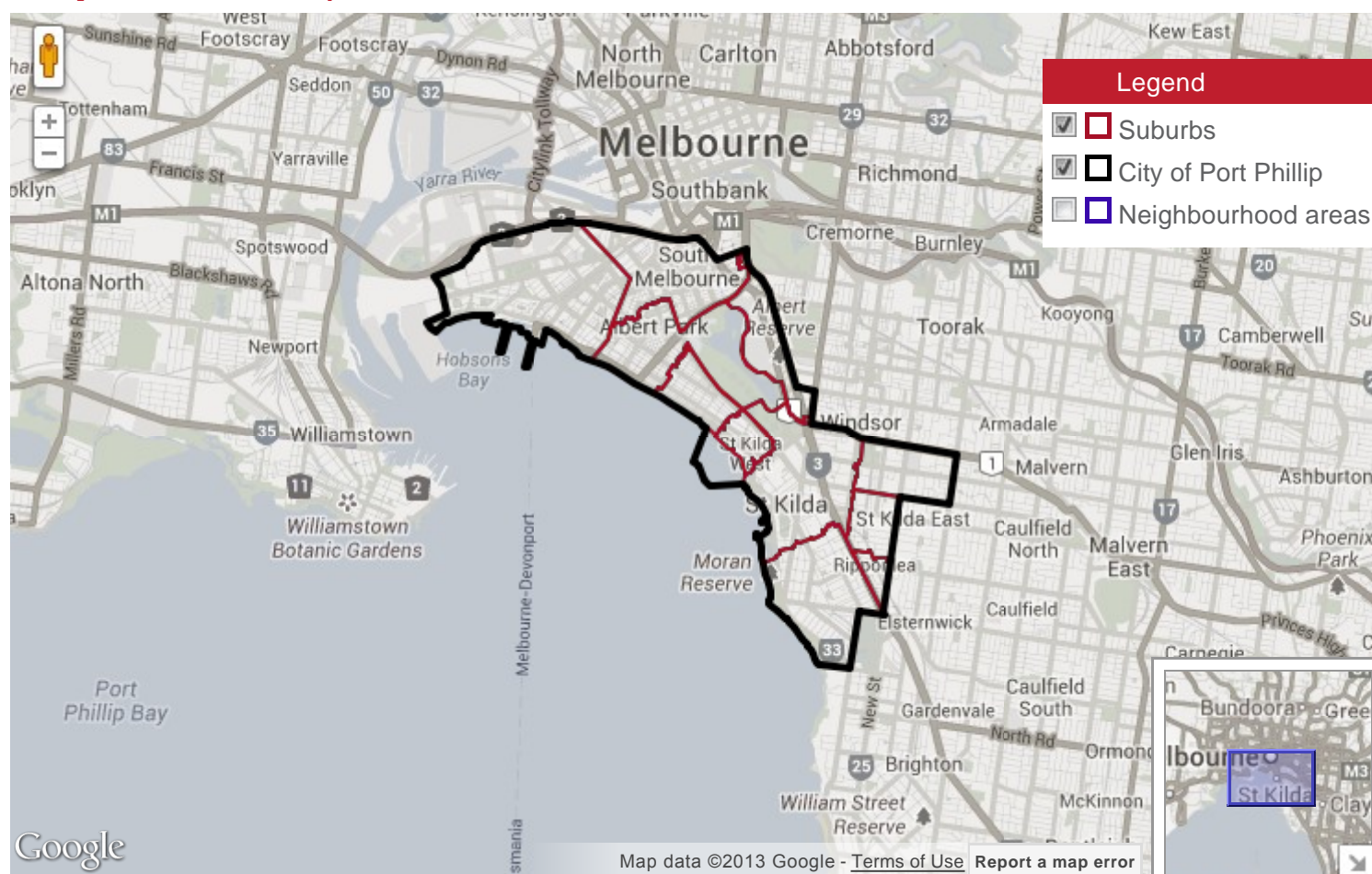
## About the area

### Location and boundaries

The City of Port Phillip is located in Melbourne's inner southern suburbs, between 2 and 8 kilometres from the Melbourne GPO. The City of Port Phillip is bounded by the Cities of Melbourne and Stonnington in the north, the City of Glen Eira in the east, the City of Bayside in the south, and Port Phillip Bay and the City of Melbourne in the west.

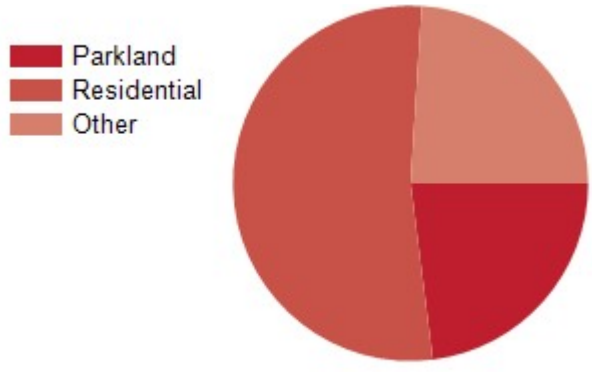
### Settlement history

European settlement dates from the 1840s, with development initially around the current centres of St Kilda, Port Melbourne and South Melbourne. Growth accelerated after the 1850s, spurred by increased accessibility. Expansion continued throughout the late 1800s and early 1900s, with most of the City built out by WWI. Some growth took place in the interwar period, particularly in Port Melbourne. Significant development occurred during the post-war years, when many migrants moved into the area and public housing estates were built. Rapid growth took place during the 1960s, aided by the construction of many flats and apartments. Growth continued throughout the 1980s and 1990s, as many industrial sites and surplus government and utility land were converted into residential use. The population increased from about 70,000 in 1991 to about 78,000 in 2001, then to nearly 92,000 in 2011. Most of this growth has been in the areas closest to the foreshore (Port Melbourne) and in the St Kilda Road area.

## Land use

The City of Port Phillip is a residential and commercial area, with substantial industrial and office land use. The City contains significant parks, gardens and foreshores. The southern and eastern areas are generally residential in nature, while the central part of the City is dominated by Albert Park. The northern and western areas are dominated by employment uses and commercial areas, including shopping and lifestyle strips along several of the main roads.

## Transport

The City of Port Phillip is served by several tram lines, the St Kilda and Port Melbourne light rail lines, and the Sandringham railway line.

## Major features

Major features of the City include the shopping precincts/retail areas of Bay Street (Port Melbourne), Carlisle Street (Balaclava), Clarendon Street (South Melbourne) and Fitzroy and Acland Streets and St Kilda Road (St Kilda), The Esplanade Market, South Melbourne Market, Albert Park, Albert Park Lake, Melbourne Sports & Aquatic Centre, Lakeside Stadium (Bob Jane Stadium), Luna Park, St Kilda Pier, Station Pier, St Kilda-Williamstown Ferry, Catani Gardens, St Kilda Botanical Gardens, St Vincent Gardens, Gasworks Art Park, St Kilda Sea Baths, Palais Theatre, Jewish Museum of Australia, various beaches and the Port Phillip Bay foreshore.

## Indigenous background

The original inhabitants of the Port Phillip area were the Bunurong or Kulin Aboriginal people.

## Included areas

The City of Port Phillip includes the suburbs of Albert Park, Balaclava, Elwood, Melbourne (part), Middle Park, Port Melbourne (part), Ripponlea, South Melbourne, Southbank (part), St Kilda, St Kilda East (part), St Kilda West and Windsor (part).



## Five year age groups

The Age Structure of City of Port Phillip provides key insights into the level of demand for age based services and facilities such as child care. It is also an indicator of City of Port Phillip's residential role and function and how it is likely to change in the future.

Five year age groups present a classic age profile of the population. Each age group covers exactly five years, which enables direct comparison between each group.

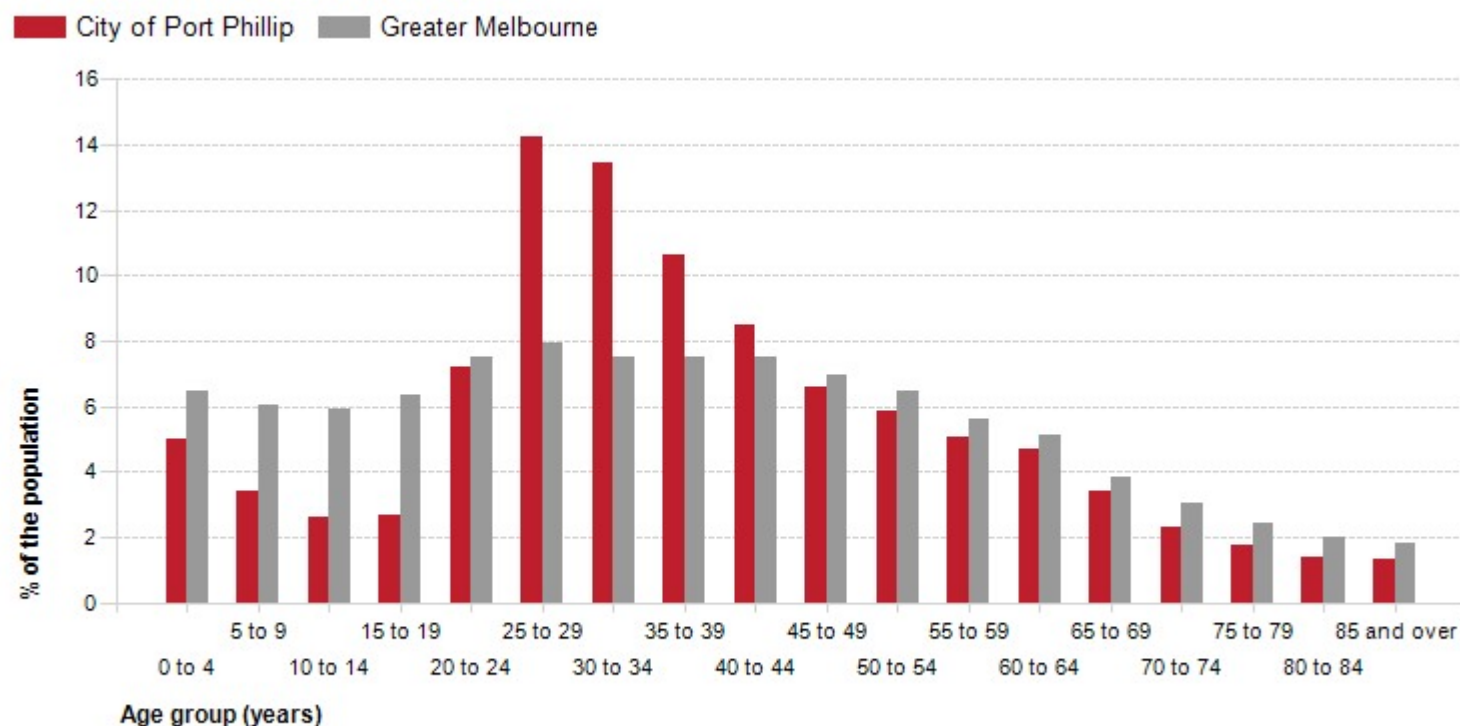

## Five year age structure, 2011

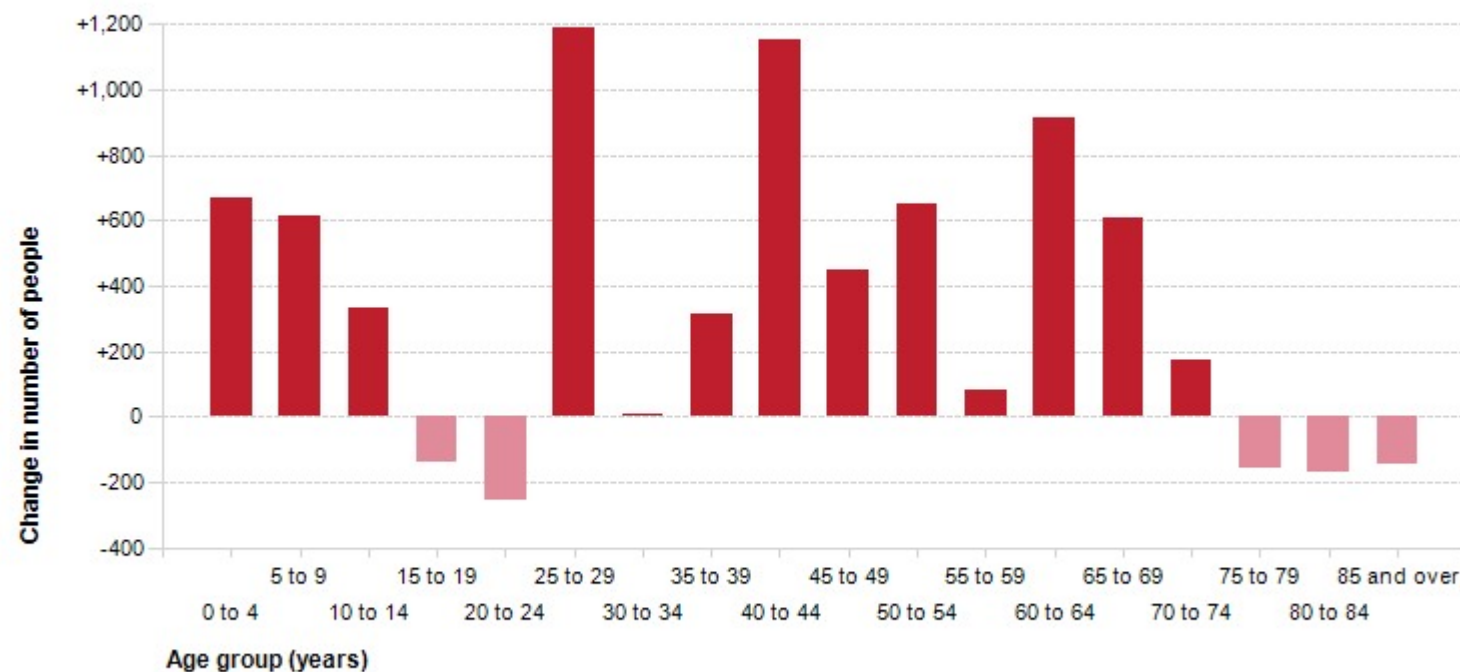

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the five year age groups of City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of people in the younger age groups (under 15) as well as a lower proportion of people in the older age groups (65+).

Overall, 11.0% of the population was aged between 0 and 15, and 10.1% were aged 65 years and over, compared with 18.5% and 13.1% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The major differences between the age structure of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons aged 25 to 29 (14.2% compared to 7.9%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons aged 30 to 34 (13.5% compared to 7.5%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons aged 35 to 39 (10.6% compared to 7.5%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons aged 40 to 44 (8.5% compared to 7.5%)

## Emerging groups

---

From 2006 to 2011, City of Port Phillip's population increased by 6,277 people (7.4%). This represents an average annual population change of 1.43% per year over the period.

The largest changes in age structure in this area between 2006 and 2011 were in the age groups:

- 25 to 29 (+1,192 persons)
- 40 to 44 (+1,154 persons)
- 60 to 64 (+911 persons)
- 0 to 4 (+668 persons)

# Ancestry

Ancestry defines the cultural association and ethnic background of an individual going back three generations. Ancestry is a good measure of the total size of cultural groups in City of Port Phillip regardless of where they were born or what language they speak.

Ancestry data, should be combined with data on [Birthplace](#), [Language Spoken at Home](#) and [Religion](#) for a more complete picture of City of Port Phillip's ethnic characteristics.

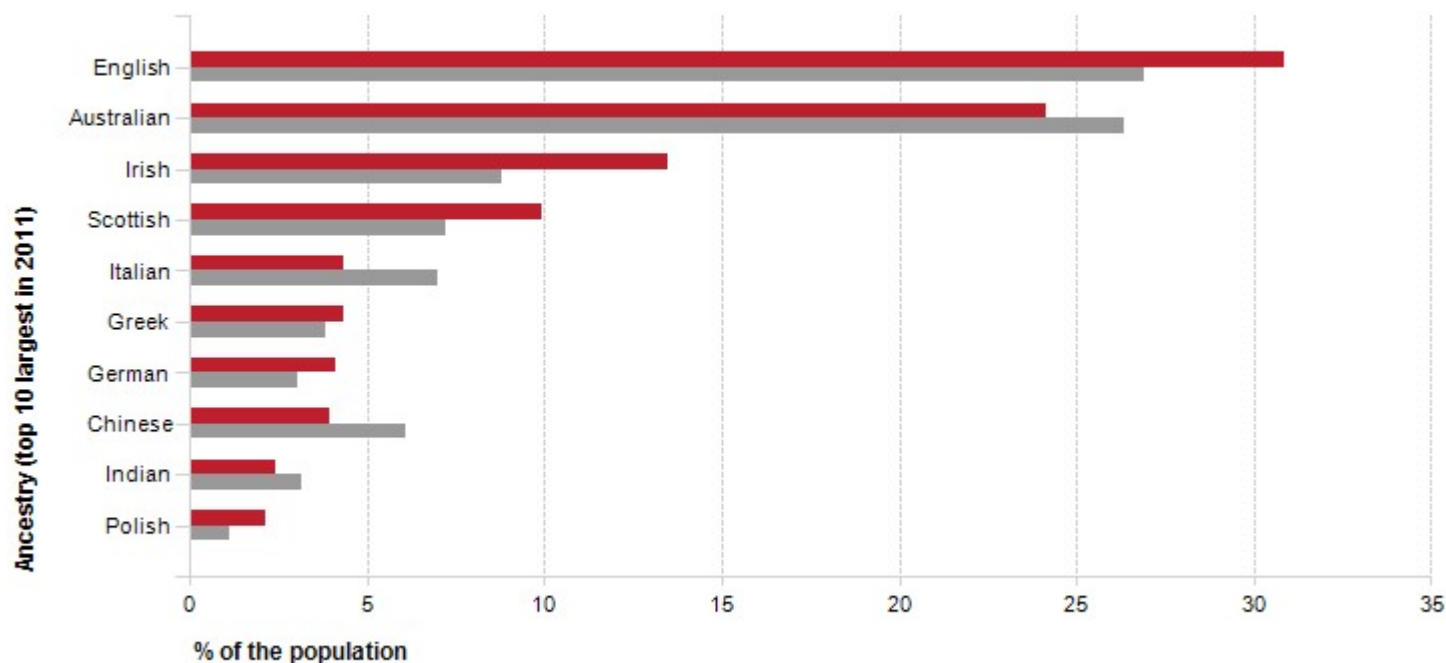

City of Port Phillip Greater Melbourne

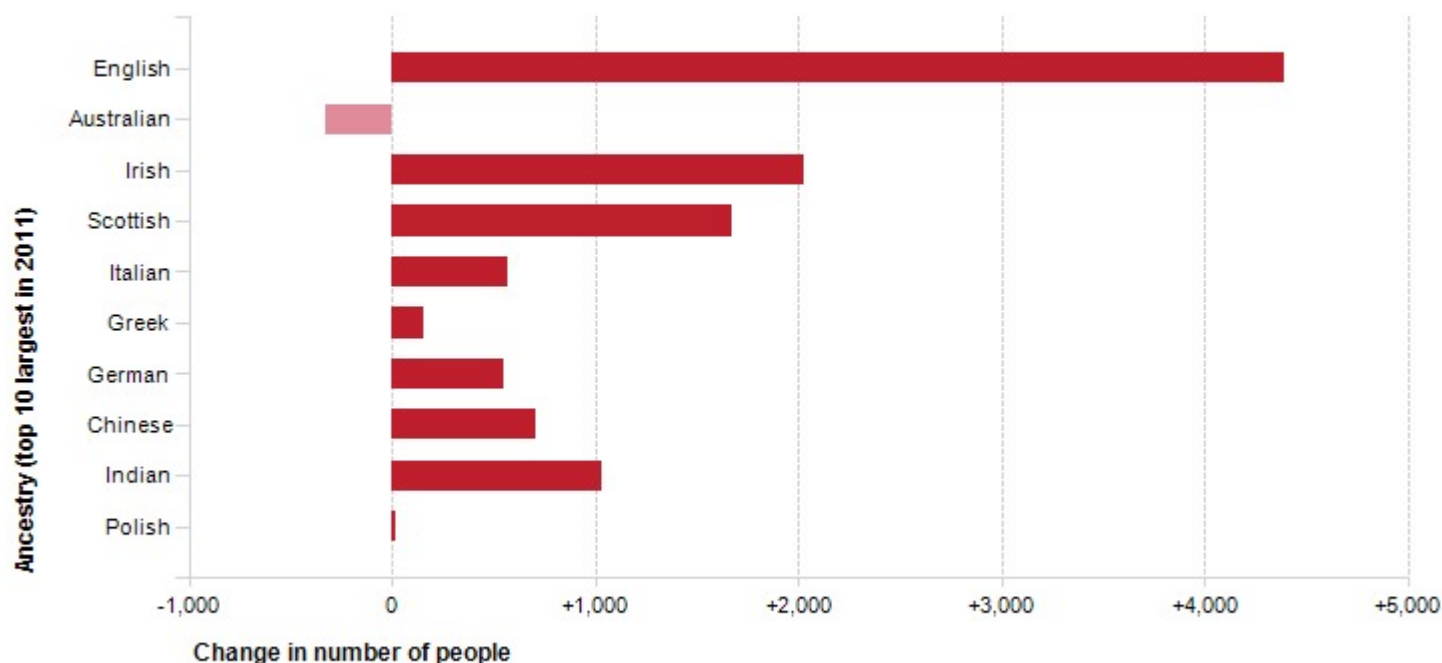

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the ancestry responses of the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 shows that the top five ancestries nominated were:

- English (28,182 people or 30.8%)
- Australian (22,077 people or 24.2%)
- Irish (12,325 people or 13.5%)
- Scottish (9,059 people or 9.9%)
- Italian (3,986 people or 4.4%)

In combination these five ancestries account for 75,629 responses in total, or 82.77% of all responses.

The major differences between the ancestries of the population in City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of people with Irish ancestry (13.5% compared to 8.8%)
- A *larger* percentage of people with English ancestry (30.8% compared to 26.9%)
- A *larger* percentage of people with Scottish ancestry (9.9% compared to 7.2%)
- A *larger* percentage of people with Jewish ancestry (1.5% compared to 0.3%)

The largest changes in the reported ancestries of the population in this area between 2006 and 2011 were:

- English (+4,392 persons)
- Irish (+2,028 persons)
- Scottish (+1,675 persons)
- Indian (+1,035 persons)

# Birthplace

Country of Birth data identifies where people were born and is indicative of the level of cultural diversity in City of Port Phillip. The mix of Country of Birth groups is also indicative of historical settlement patterns, as source countries for Australia's immigration program have varied significantly over time.

To get a more complete picture of cultural and ethnic characteristics, City of Port Phillip's Country of Birth data should be viewed together with [Ancestry](#), [Language Spoken at Home](#) and [Religion](#).

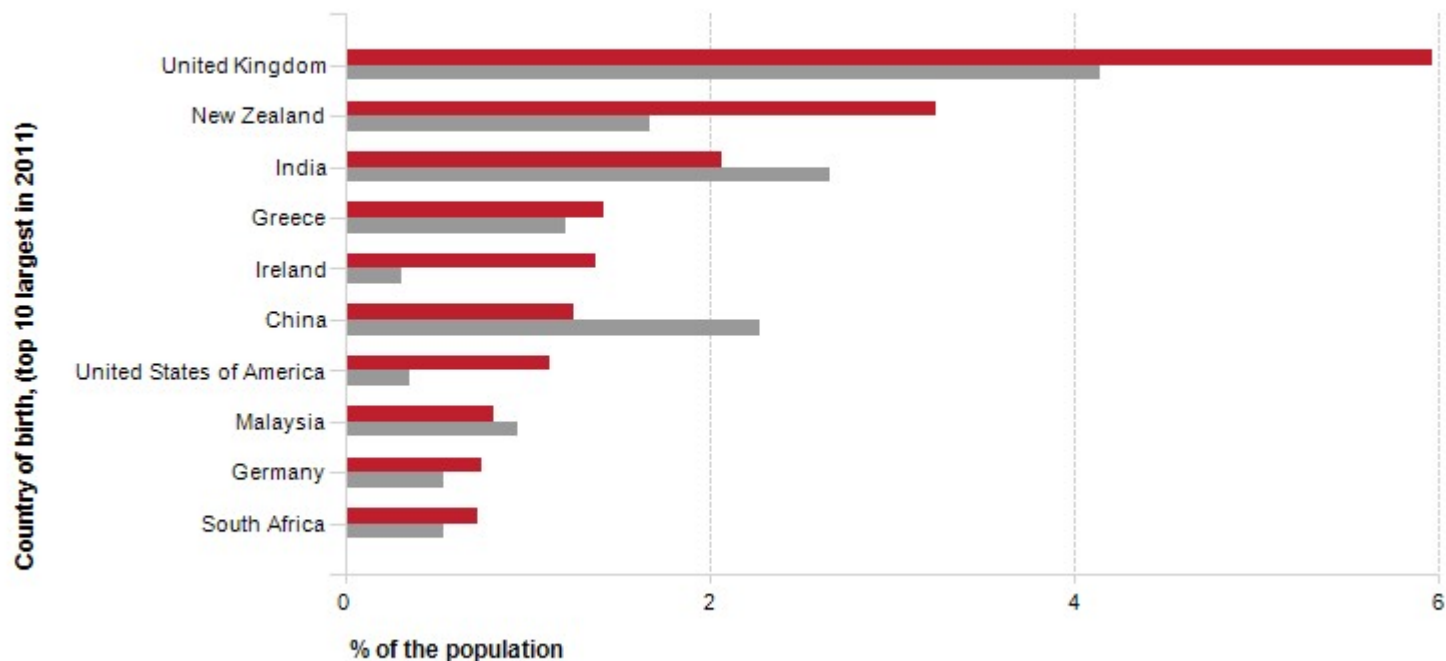

City of Port Phillip Greater Melbourne

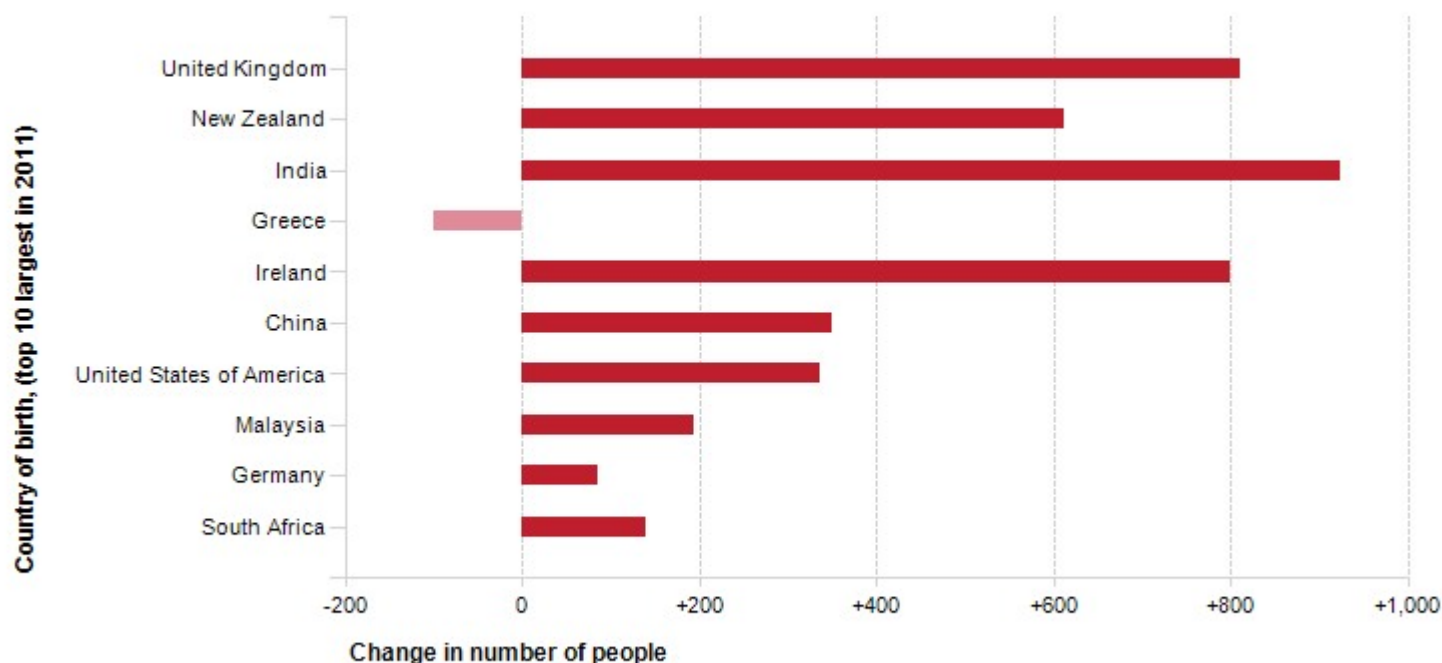

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the country of birth of the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a similar proportion of people born overseas, and a similar proportion of people from a non-English speaking background.

Overall, 31.0% of the population was born overseas, and 18.1% were from a non-English speaking background, compared with 31.4% and 24.2% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The largest non-English speaking country of birth in City of Port Phillip was India, where 2.1% of the population, or 1,890 people, were born.

**The major differences between the countries of birth of the population in City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:**

- A *larger* percentage of people born in United Kingdom (6.0% compared to 4.1%)
- A *larger* percentage of people born in New Zealand (3.2% compared to 1.7%)
- A *larger* percentage of people born in Ireland (1.4% compared to 0.3%)
- A *smaller* percentage of people born in Vietnam (0.3% compared to 1.7%)

## Emerging groups

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Between 2006 and 2011, the number of people born overseas increased by 5,463 or 23.9%, and the number of people from a non-English speaking background increased by 2,677 or 19.3%.

**The largest changes in birthplace countries of the population in this area between 2006 and 2011 were for those born in:**

- India (+924 persons)
- United Kingdom (+811 persons)
- Ireland (+800 persons)
- New Zealand (+612 persons)

## Year of arrival in Australia

The Year of Arrival data records when the overseas born population arrived in Australia. The data shows the degree to which areas are 'ports' for new overseas migrants and reveals the role of City of Port Phillip in housing the overseas-born. The number of recent arrivals in an area is often determined by housing affordability, employment opportunities and pre-existing communities located in the area.

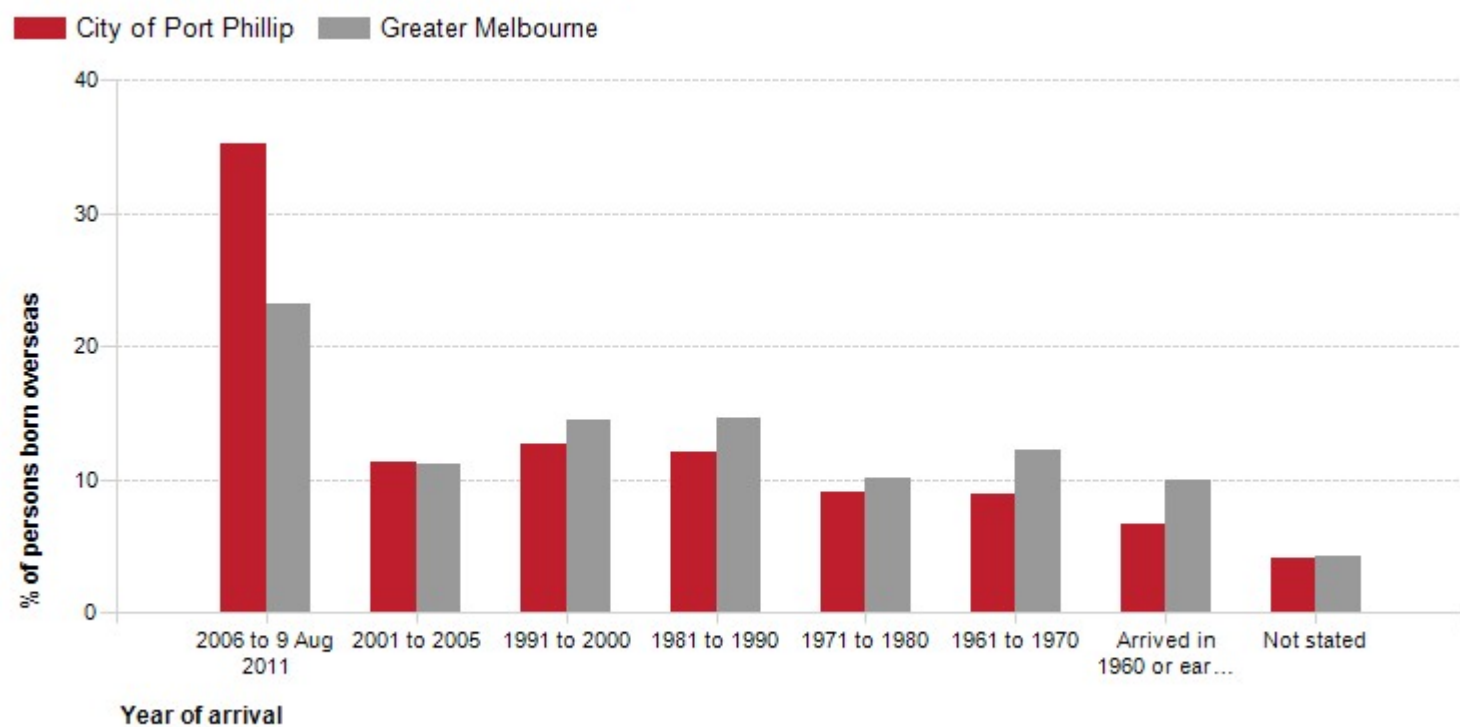
City of Port Phillip's Year of Arrival data, when used with Birthplace, Religion and Language Spoken at Home data, is a good indicator of the likely need for services in migrant communities.

## Dominant groups

---

Analysis of the year of arrival for the overseas born population of City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a smaller proportion of people who arrived before 2001, and a larger proportion of recent arrivals (those who arrived between 2006 and 2011).

Overall, 49.4% of the overseas born population arrived before 2001, and 35.2% arrived during or after 2006, compared with 61.4% and 23.2% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The major differences between the year of arrival data of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of arrivals between 2006 and 9 Aug 2011 (35.2% compared to 23.2%)
- A *smaller* percentage of arrivals between in 1960 or earlier (6.7% compared to 10.0%)
- A *smaller* percentage of arrivals between 1961 and 1970 (9.0% compared to 12.3%)
- A *smaller* percentage of arrivals between 1981 and 1990 (12.1% compared to 14.7%)

# Proficiency in English

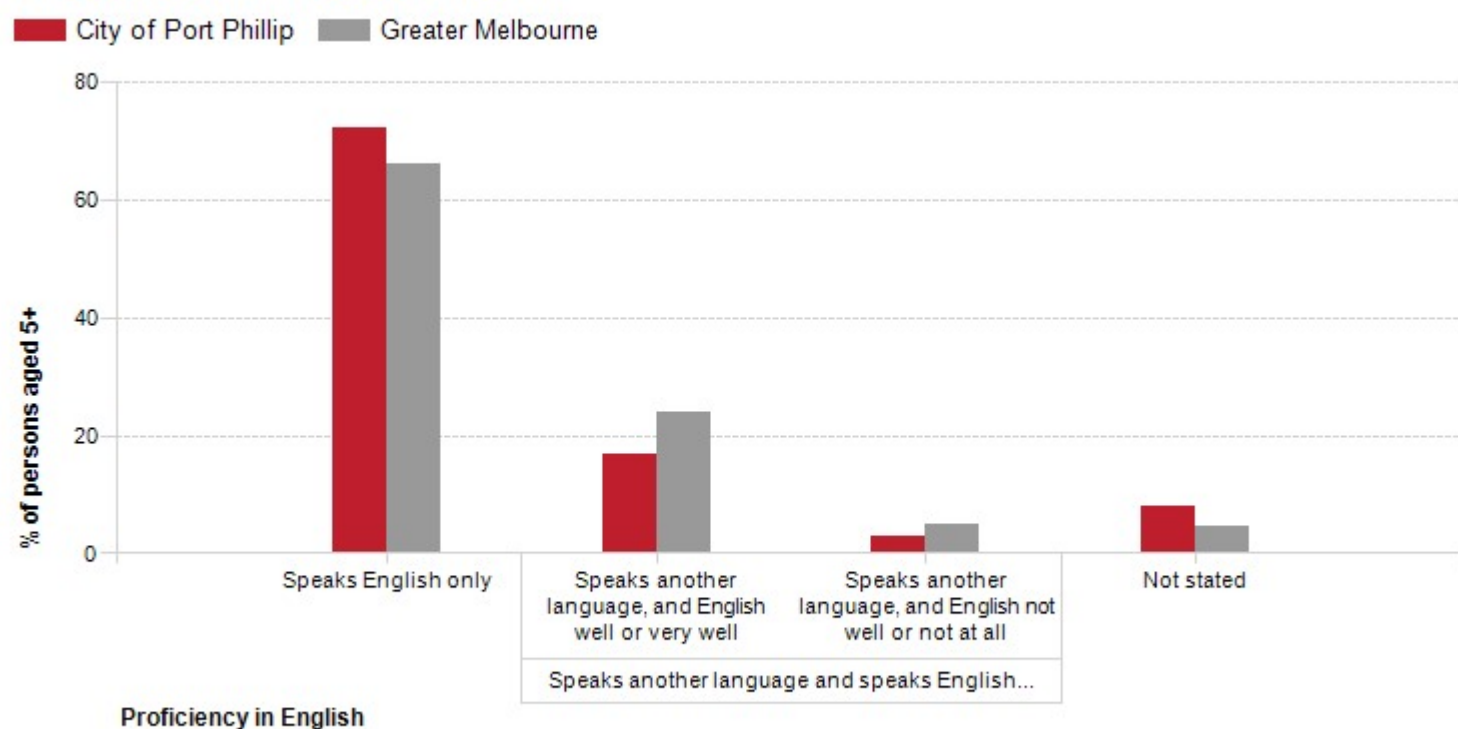
Proficiency in English measures the self-assessed proficiency in spoken English of people who speak a language other than English at home. The data, when viewed with other ethnic and cultural indicators, such as Ancestry, Country of Birth, Language Spoken at Home and Religion, reflects City of Port Phillip's ethnic composition and how long the overseas born have been in Australia. This helps service providers determine whether they need to communicate with the local population in languages other than English.

## Proficiency in English, 2011

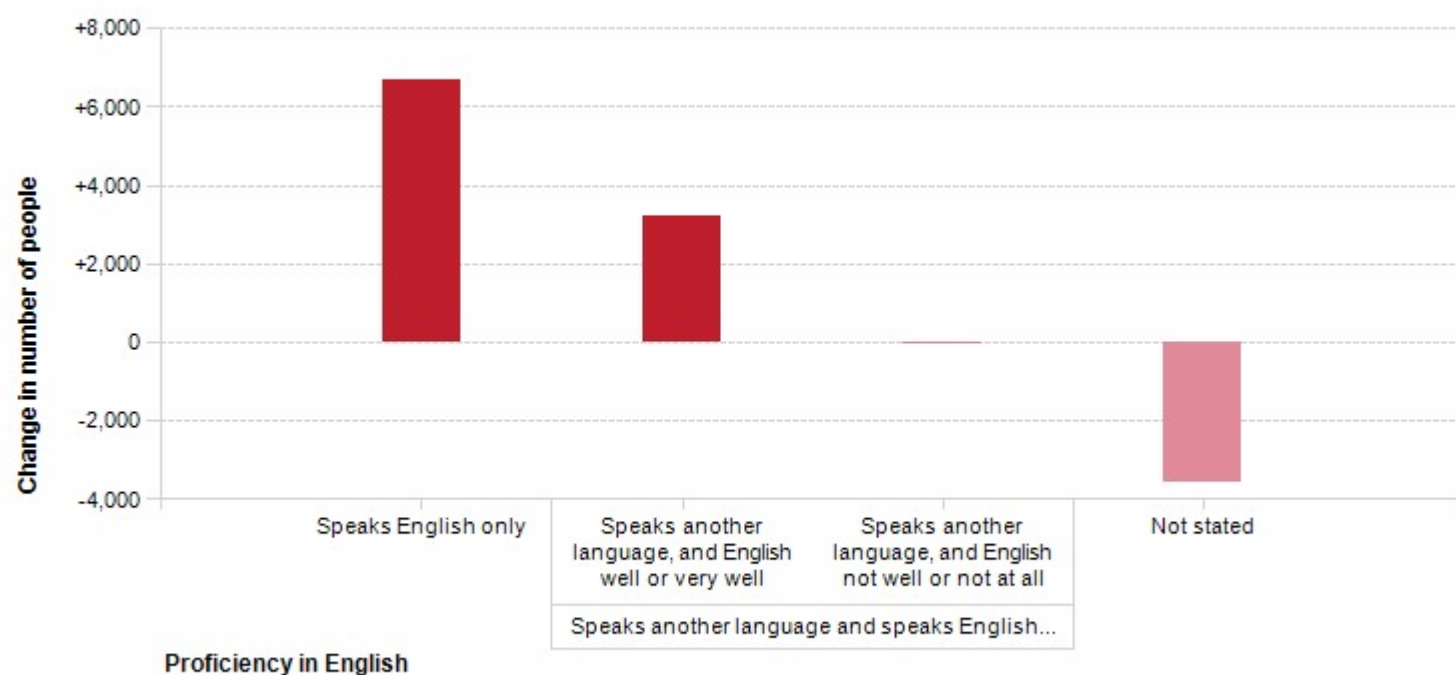

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the proficiency in English data for City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a higher proportion of persons who spoke English only, and a lower proportion of persons who spoke another language and English not well or not at all.

Overall, 72.3% of persons spoke English only, and 2.8% spoke another language and English not well or not at all, compared with 66.3% and 5.0% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

## Emerging groups

The most significant changes in the proficiency in English of the population in this area between 2006 and 2011 were in those speaking:

- Speaks English only (+6,667 persons)
- Speaks another language, and English well or very well (+3,242 persons)
- Speaks another language, and English not well or not at all (-70 persons)

# Language spoken at home

City of Port Phillip's language statistics show the proportion of the population who speak a language at home other than English. They indicate how culturally diverse a population is and the degree to which different ethnic groups and nationalities are retaining their language.

City of Port Phillip's language statistics should be analysed in conjunction with Country of Birth and Proficiency in English to assist in identifying specific cultural and ethnic groups in the area and the services required by the multicultural community.

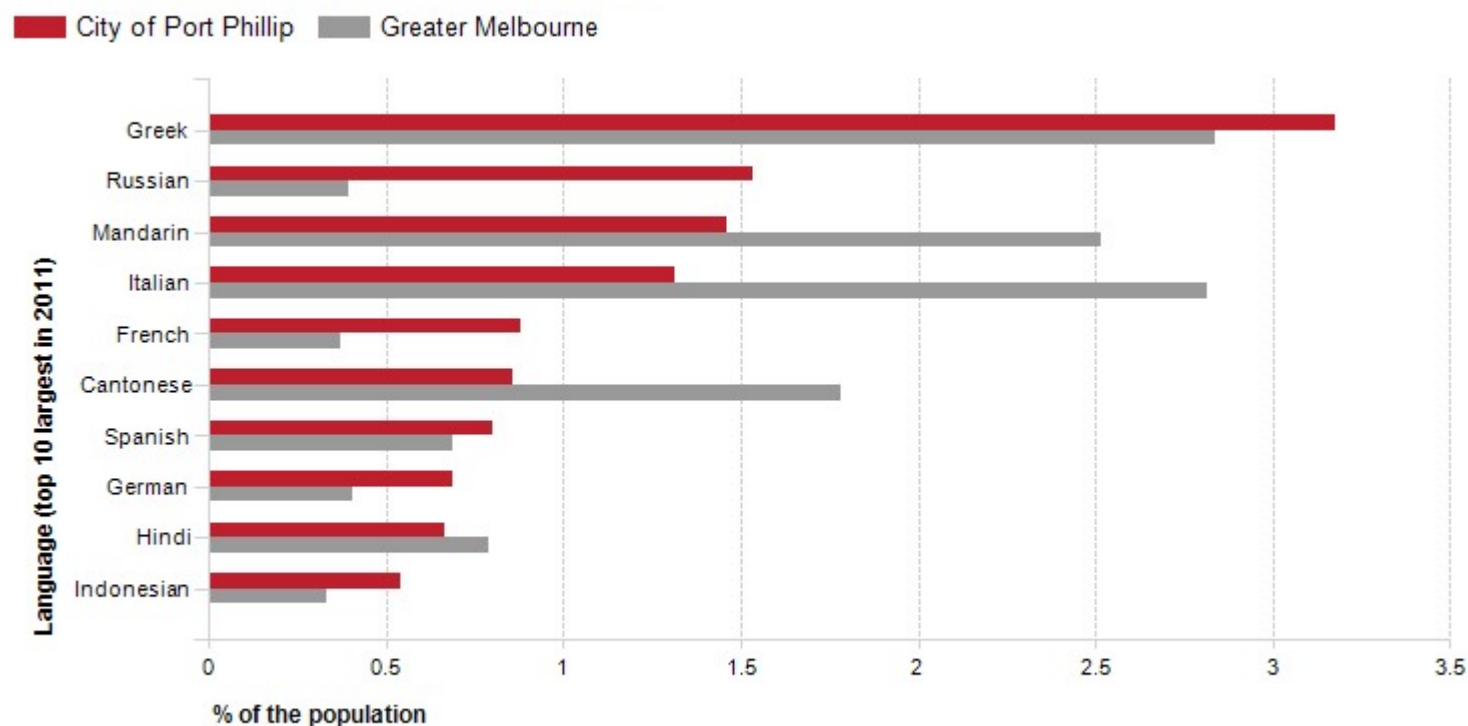

## Language spoken at home, 2011

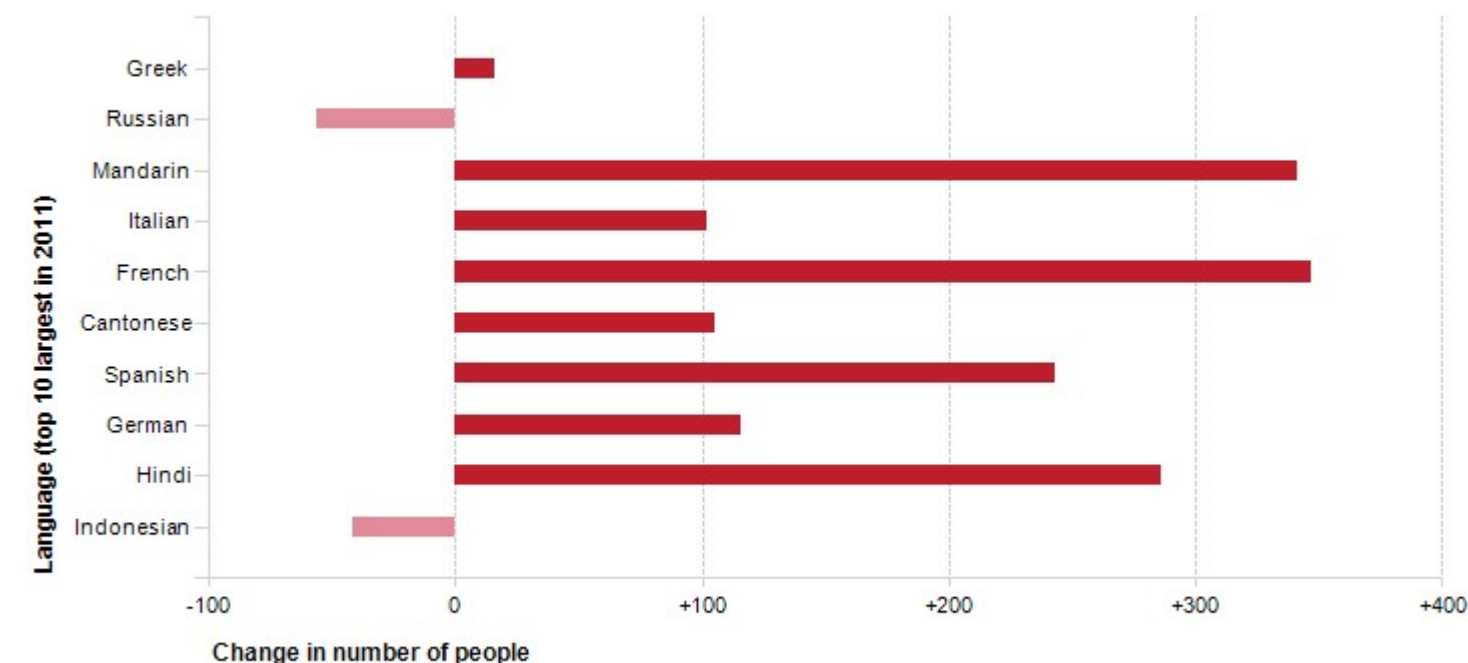

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the language spoken at home by the population of City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a larger proportion of people who spoke English only, and a smaller proportion of those speaking a non-English language (either exclusively, or in addition to English).

Overall, 72.4% of the population spoke English only, and 19.7% spoke a non-English language, compared with 66.3% and 29.1% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The dominant language spoken at home, other than English, in City of Port Phillip was Greek, with 3.2% of the population, or 2,903 people speaking this language at home.

**The major differences between the languages spoken at home for the population of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne in 2011 were:**

- A *larger* percentage speaking Russian at home (1.5% compared to 0.4%)
- A *smaller* percentage speaking Vietnamese at home (0.3% compared to 2.1%)
- A *smaller* percentage speaking Italian at home (1.3% compared to 2.8%)
- A *smaller* percentage speaking Arabic at home (0.4% compared to 1.6%)

## Emerging groups

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Between 2006 and 2011, the number of people who spoke a language other than English at home increased by 3,024 or 20.2%, and the number of people who spoke English only increased by 6,669 or 11.2%.

**The largest changes in the spoken languages of the population in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were for those speaking:**

- French (+347 persons)
- Mandarin (+341 persons)
- Hindi (+286 persons)
- Gujarati (+250 persons)



# Religion

City of Port Phillip's religion statistics provide an indicator of cultural identity and ethnicity when observed in conjunction with other key variables. Religion data reveal the major concentrations of religions as well as revealing the proportion of people with no religious affiliation. There are a number of reasons for different religious compositions across areas including the country of birth and ethnic background of the population, the age of the population (belief in religion is generally stronger, the older the population) and changes in values and belief systems.

City of Port Phillip's religion statistics should be analysed in conjunction with other ethnicity statistics such as [Country of Birth](#) data and [Language Spoken](#) data to assist in identifying specific cultural and ethnic groups.

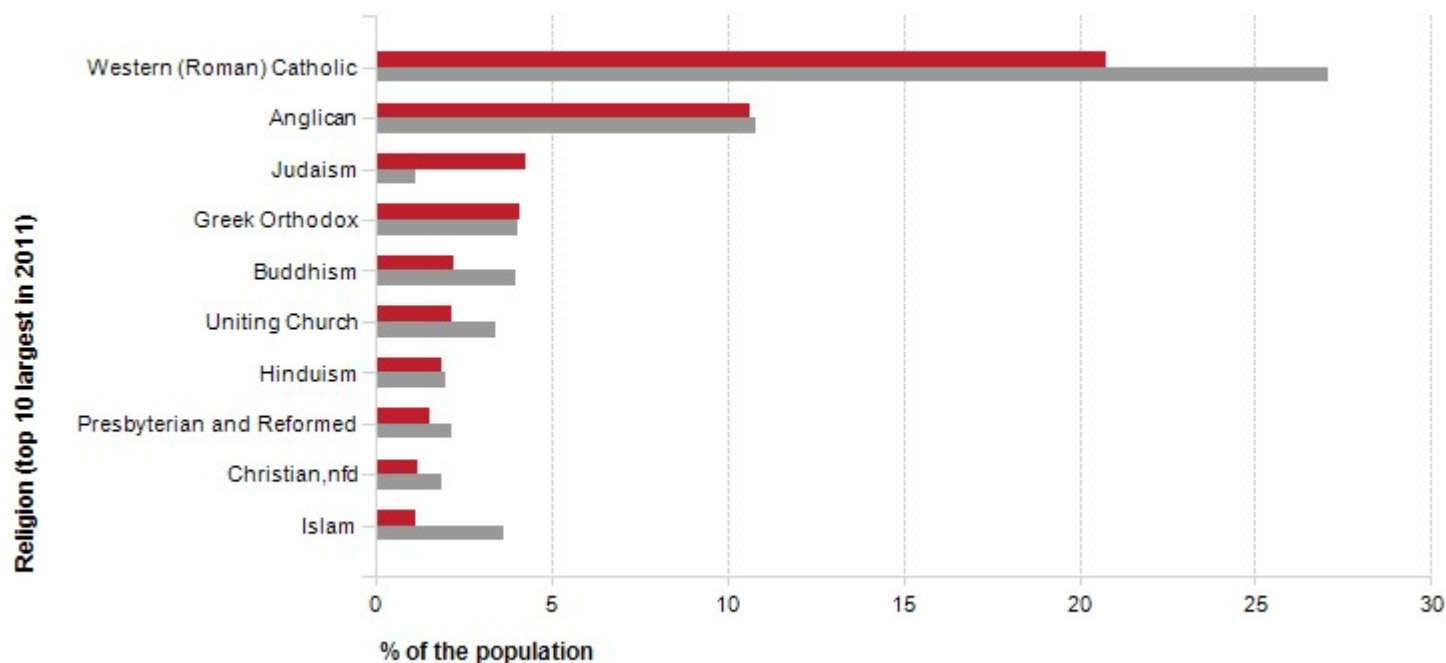

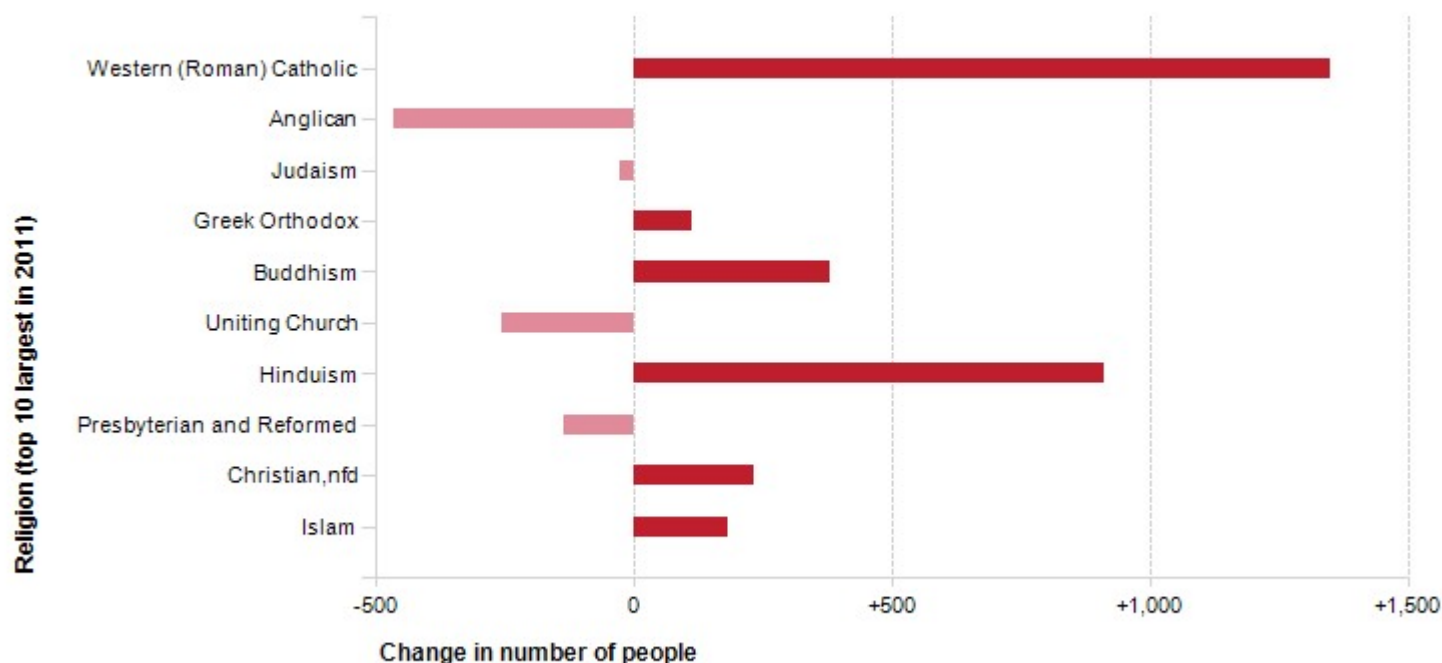

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the religious affiliation of the population of City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of people who professed a religion and a higher proportion who stated they had no religion.

Overall, 53.6% of the population nominated a religion, and 33.5% said they had no religion, compared with 67.6% and 23.5% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The largest single religion in City of Port Phillip was Western (Roman) Catholic, with 20.8% of the population or 18,966 people as adherents.

The major differences between the religious affiliation for the population of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage who nominated Judaism (4.3% compared to 1.1%)
- A *smaller* percentage who nominated Western (Roman) Catholic (20.8% compared to 27.1%)
- A *smaller* percentage who nominated Islam (1.1% compared to 3.6%)
- A *smaller* percentage who nominated Buddhism (2.2% compared to 4.0%)

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The largest changes in the religious affiliation of the population in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were for those who nominated:

- Western (Roman) Catholic (+1,348 persons)
- Hinduism (+912 persons)
- Anglican (-466 persons)
- Buddhism (+379 persons)

# Qualifications

Educational Qualifications relate to education outside of primary and secondary school and are one of the most important indicators of socio-economic status. With other data sources, such as [Employment Status](#), [Income](#) and [Occupation](#), City of Port Phillip's Educational Qualifications help to evaluate the economic opportunities and socio-economic status of the area and identify skill gaps in the labour market.

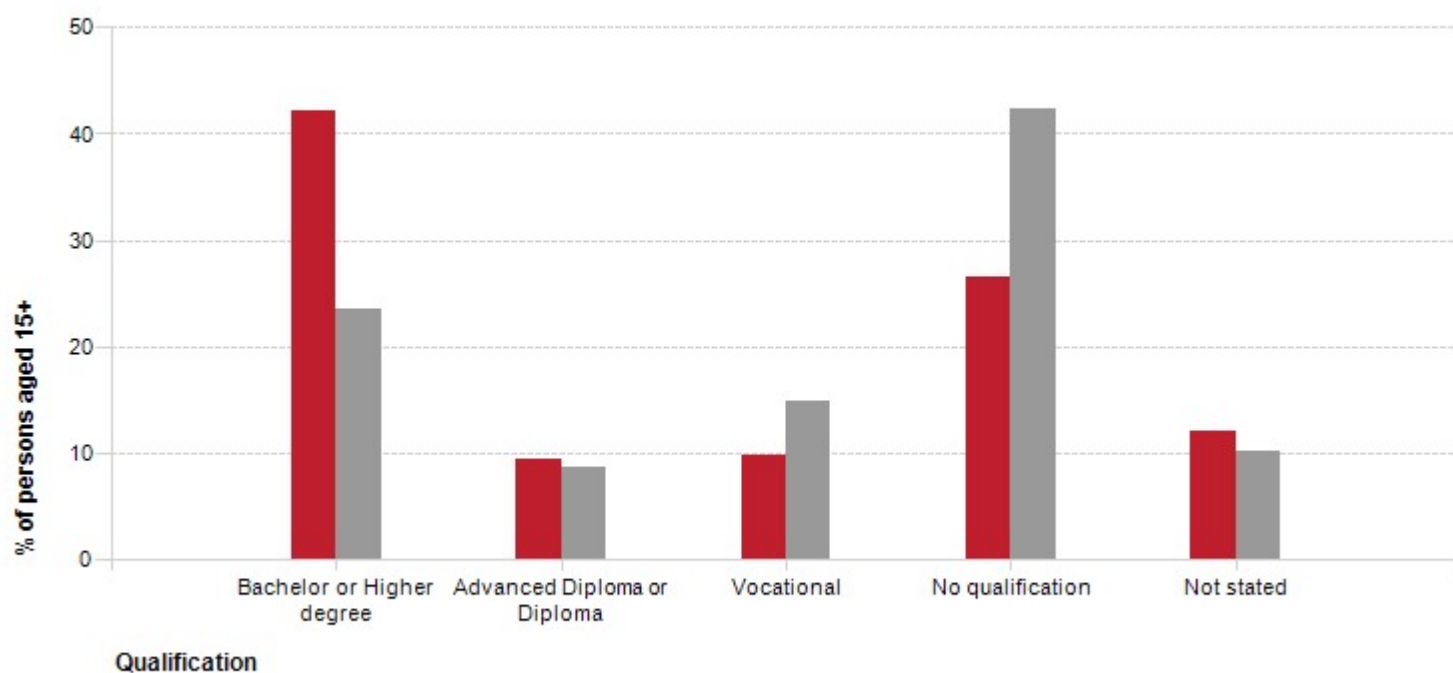

■ City of Port Phillip ■ Greater Melbourne

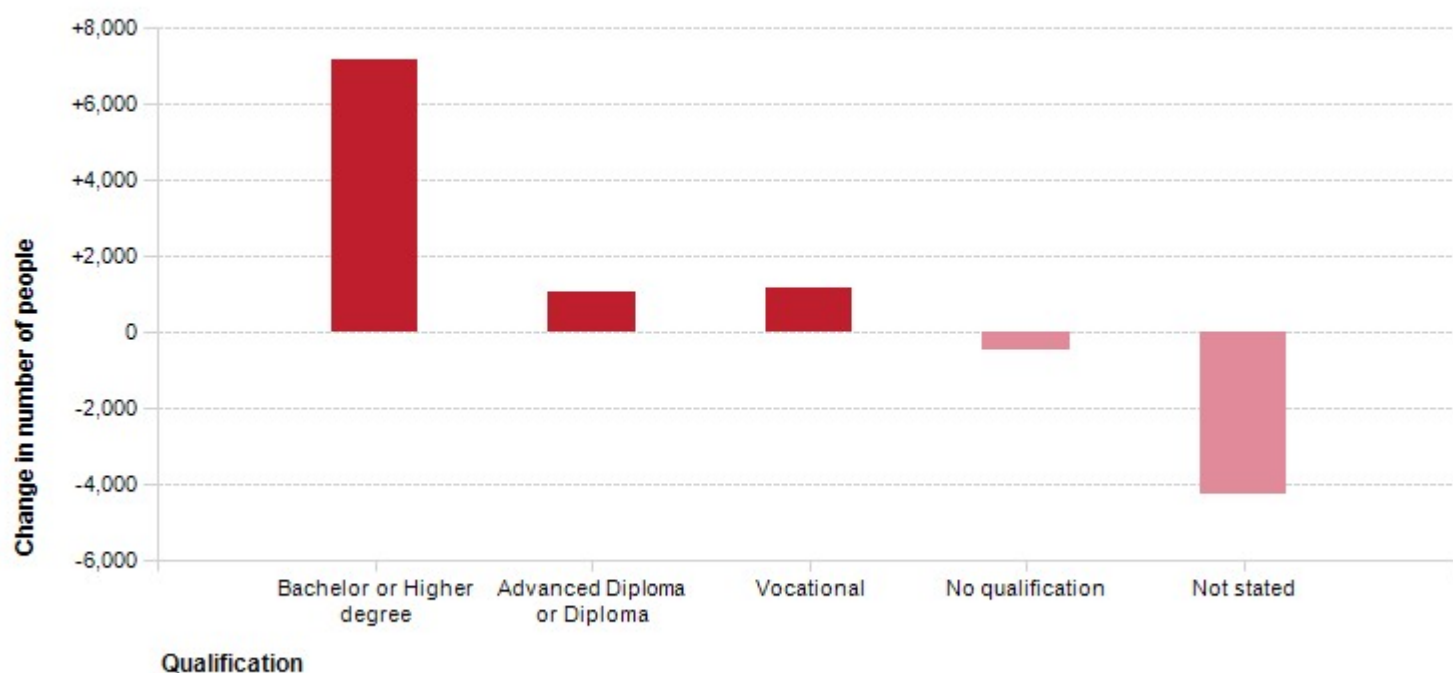

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the qualifications of the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a higher proportion of people holding formal qualifications (Bachelor or higher degree; Advanced Diploma or Diploma; or Vocational qualifications), and a lower proportion of people with no formal qualifications.

Overall, 61.6% of the population aged 15 and over held educational qualifications, and 26.5% had no qualifications, compared with 47.3% and 42.4% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The major differences between qualifications held by the population of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons with Bachelor or Higher degrees (42.2% compared to 23.6%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons with No qualifications (26.5% compared to 42.4%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons with Vocational qualifications (9.9% compared to 15.0%)

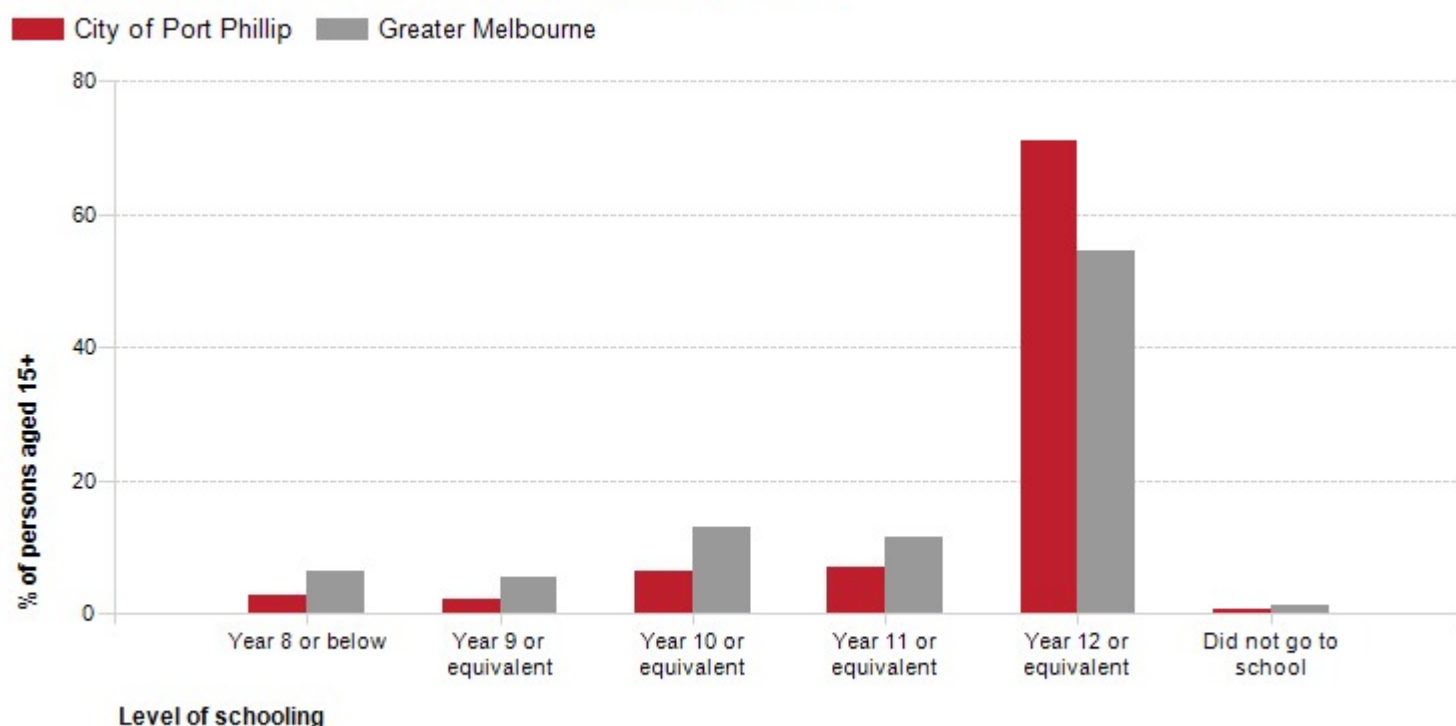

## Highest level of schooling completed, 2011

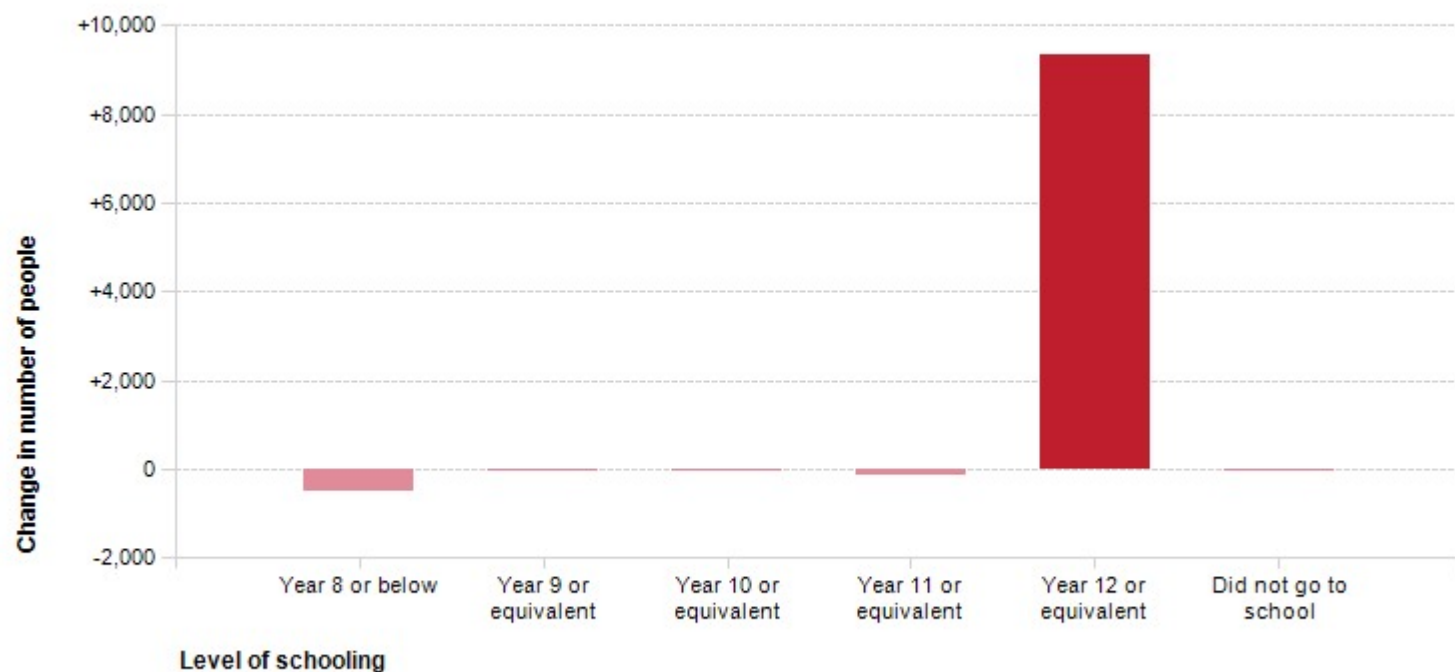

### Dominant groups

Analysis of the highest level of schooling attained by the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of people who had left school at an early level (Year 10 or less) and a higher proportion of people who completed Year 12 or equivalent.

Overall, 11.9% of the population left school at Year 10 or below, and 71.1% went on to complete Year 12 or equivalent, compared with 26.0% and 54.6% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

**The major differences between the level of schooling attained by the population in City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:**

- A *larger* percentage of persons who completed year 12 or equivalent (71.1% compared to 54.6%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons who completed year 10 or equivalent (6.3% compared to 12.9%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons who completed year 11 or equivalent (6.9% compared to 11.5%)

# Education institution attending

The share of City of Port Phillip's population attending educational institutions reflects the age structure of the population, which influences the number of children attending school; proximity to tertiary education, which can mean young adults leaving home to be nearer to educational facilities and; the degree to which people are seeking out educational opportunities in adulthood, especially in their late teens and early twenties.

This data is often combined with [Age Structure](#) to identify areas with significant university student populations.

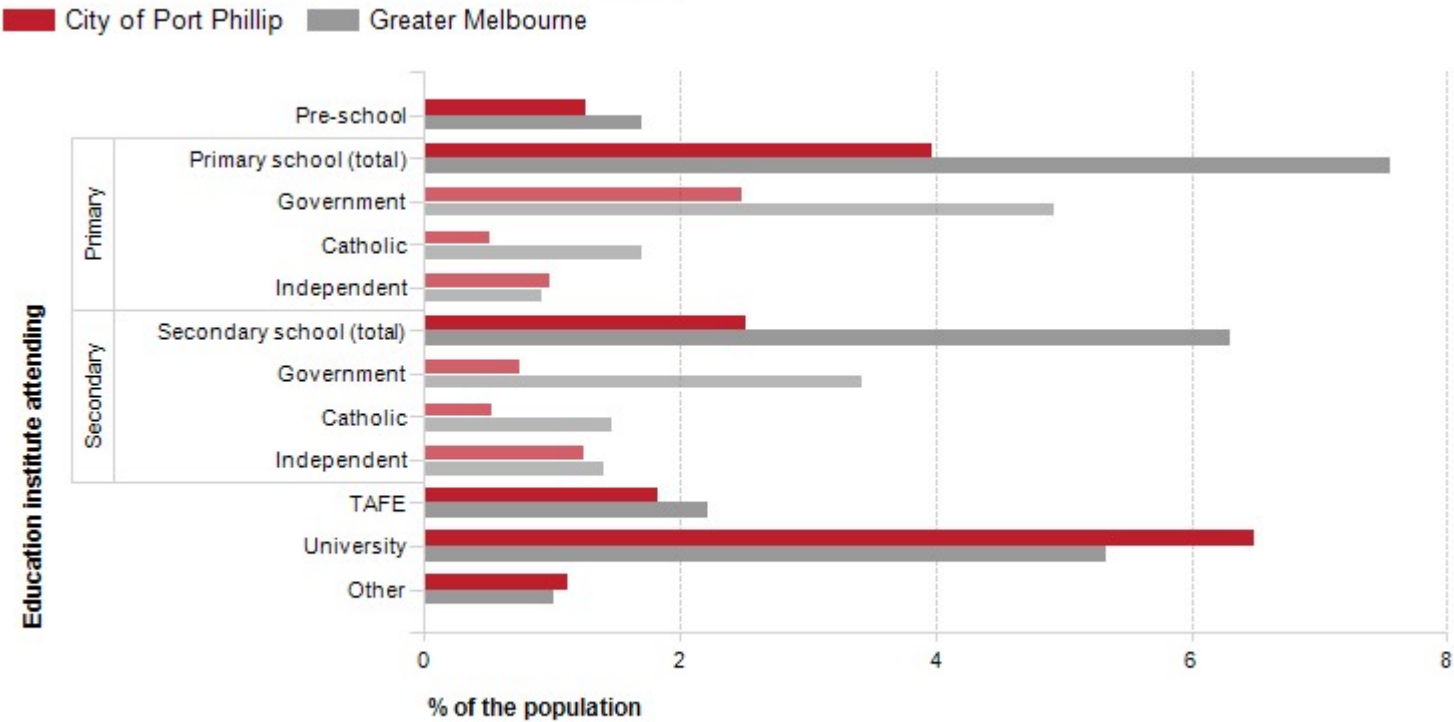

# Education institute attending, 2011

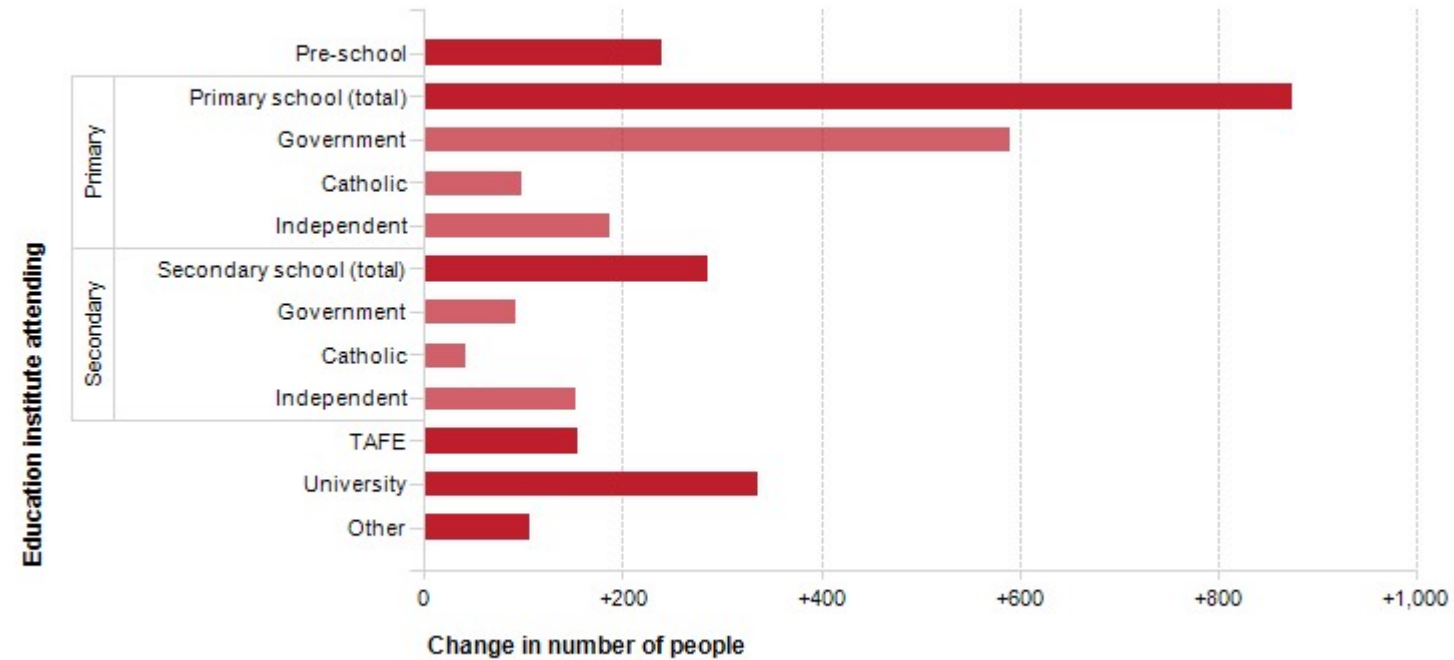

## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the share of the population attending educational institutions in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion attending primary school, a lower proportion attending secondary school, and a higher proportion engaged in tertiary level education.

Overall, 4.0% of the population were attending primary school, 2.5% of the population were attending secondary institutions, and 8.3% were learning at a tertiary level, compared with 7.6%, 6.3% and 7.6% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The major differences between the share of the population attending learning institutions in City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons not attending (73.9% compared to 69.2%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons attending University (6.5% compared to 5.3%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons attending a Government secondary school (2.5% compared to 6.3%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons attending a Government primary school (4.0% compared to 7.6%)

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From 2006 to 2011, City of Port Phillip's population aged 15 years and over increased by 6,278 people (+7.4%). This represents an average annual change of 1.43% per year over the period.

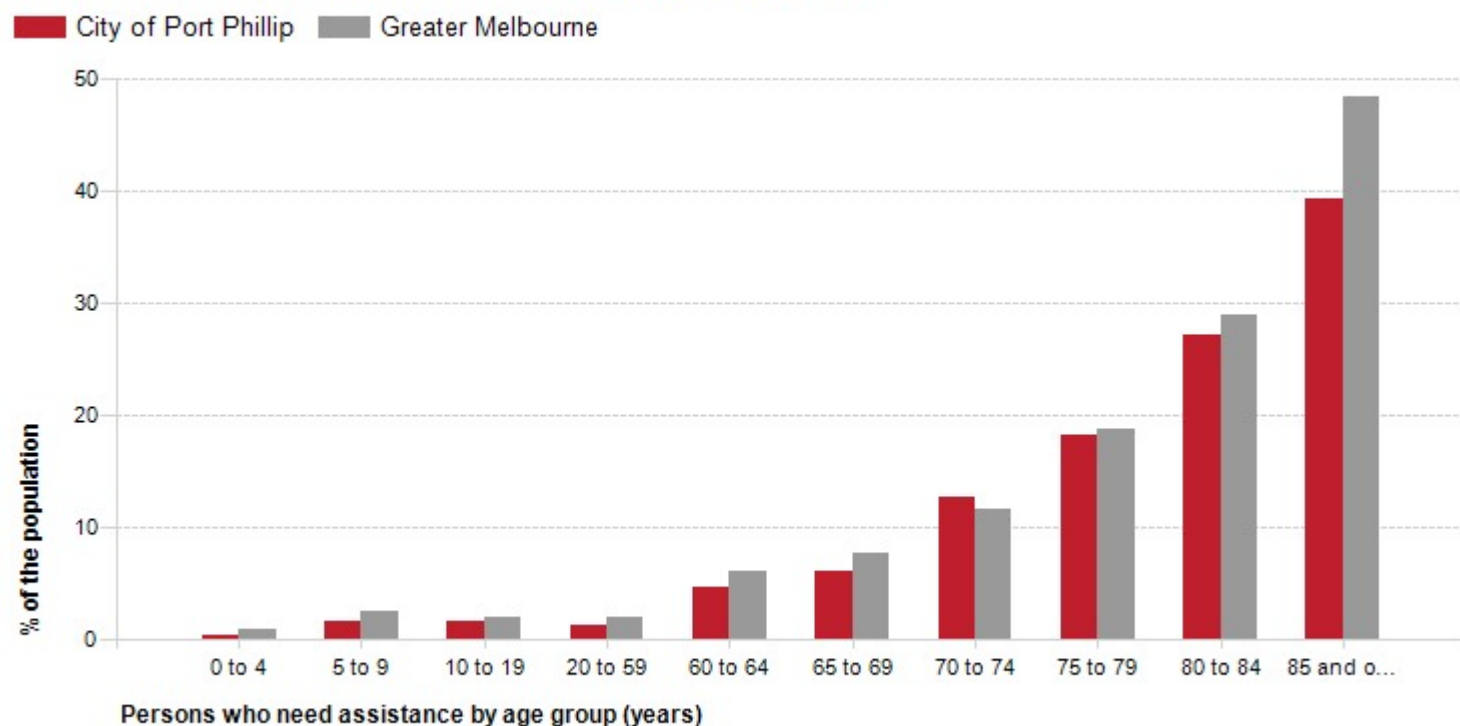

## Need for assistance with core activities, 2011

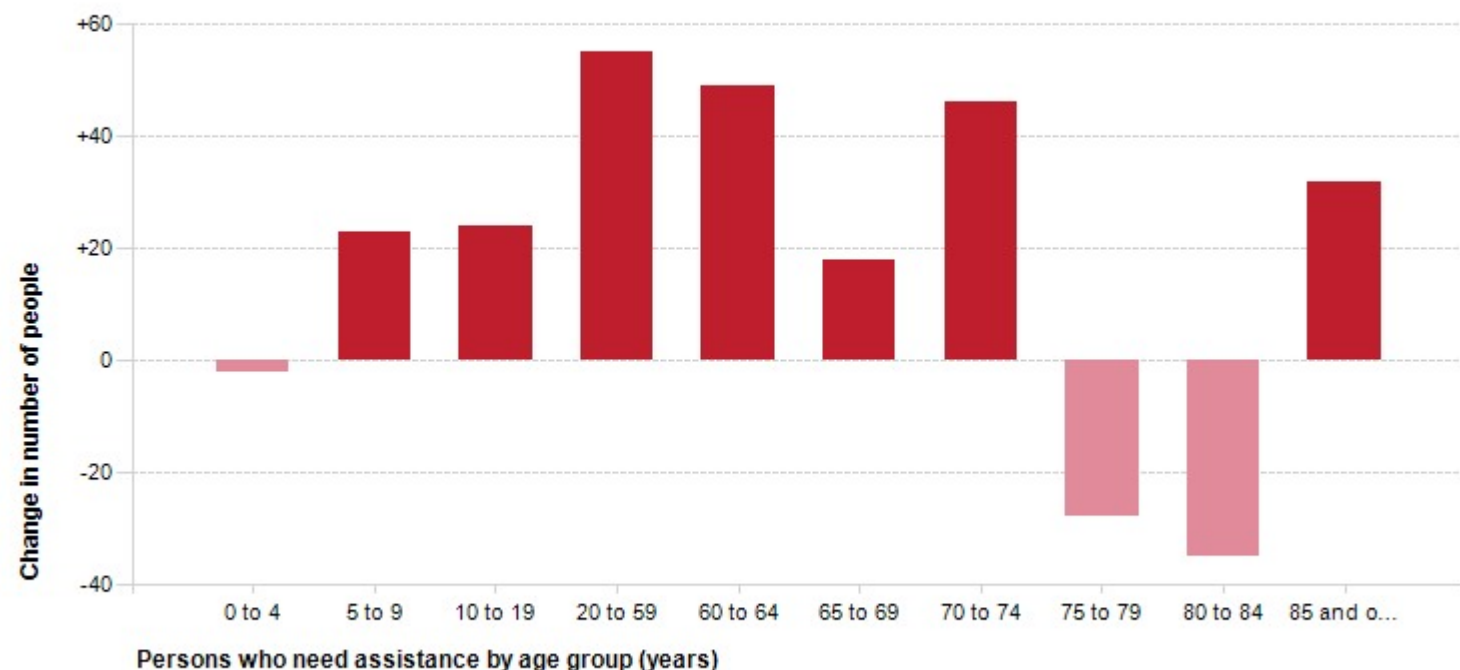

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Analysis of the need for assistance of persons in City of Port Phillip compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of persons who reported needing assistance with core activities.

Overall, 3.0% of the population reported needing assistance with core activities, compared with 4.5% for Greater Melbourne.

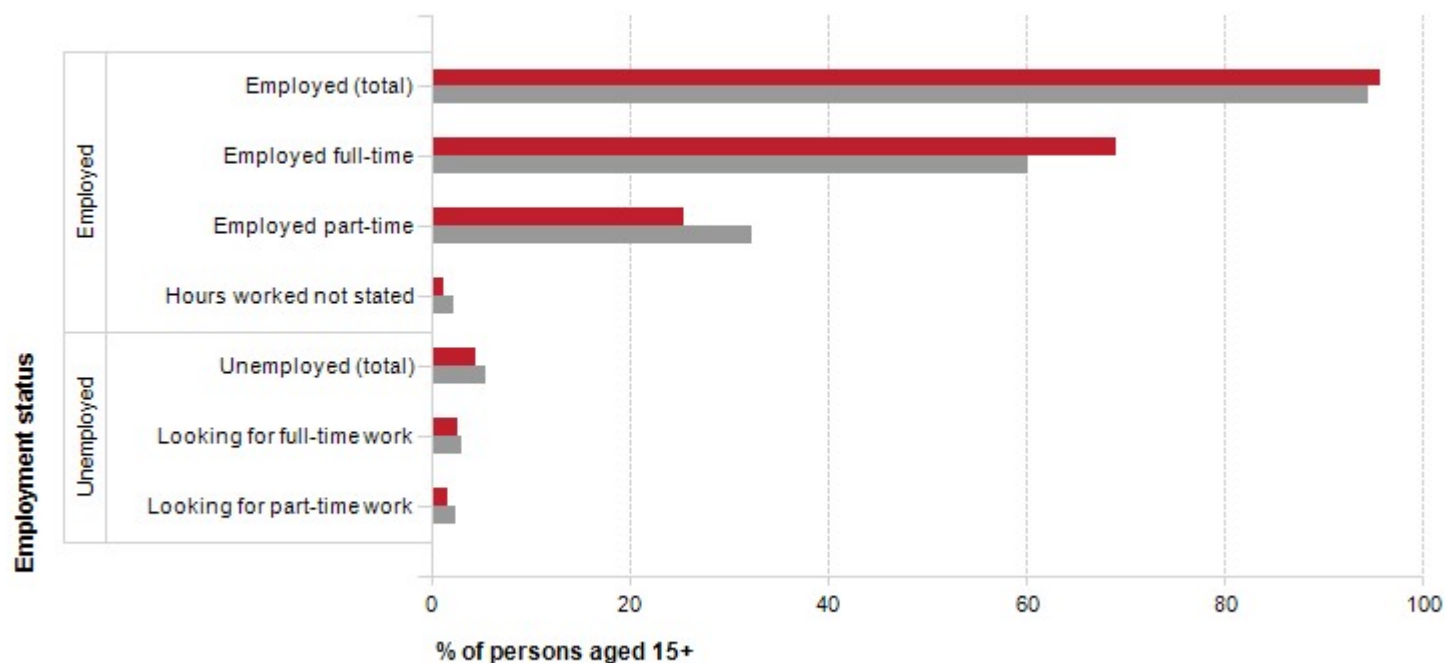

■ City of Port Phillip ■ Greater Melbourne

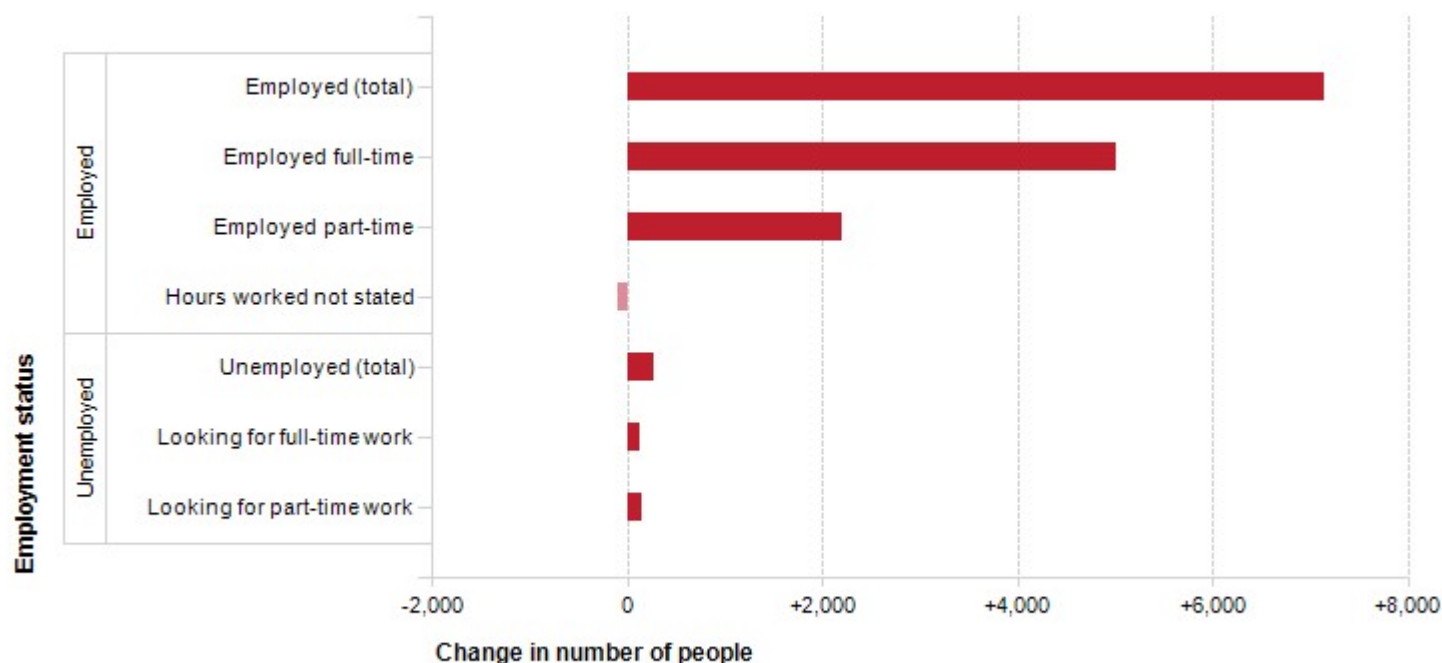

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## Dominant groups

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The size of City of Port Phillip's labour force in 2011 was 57,433 persons, of which 14,567 were employed part-time and 39,661 were full time workers.

Analysis of the employment status (as a percentage of the labour force) in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a higher proportion in employment, and a lower proportion unemployed. Overall, 95.7% of the labour force was employed (67.6% of the population aged 15+), and 4.3% unemployed (3.1% of the population aged 15+), compared with 94.5% and 5.5% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The labour force participation rate refers to the proportion of the population over 15 years of age that was employed or actively looking for work. *"The labour force is a fundamental input to domestic production. Its size and composition are therefore crucial factors in economic growth. From the viewpoint of social development, earnings from paid work are a major influence on levels of economic well-being."* (Australian Social Trends 1995).

Analysis of the labour force participation rate of the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 shows that there was a higher proportion in the labour force (70.6%) compared with Greater Melbourne (62.5%).

## Emerging groups

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Between 2006 and 2011, the number of people employed in City of Port Phillip showed an increase of 7,137 persons and the number unemployed showed an increase of 277 persons. In the same period, the number of people in the labour force showed an increase of 7,414 persons, or 14.8%.



# Industry sectors of employment

City of Port Phillip's industry statistics identify the industry sectors in which the residents work (which may be within the residing area or elsewhere). This will be influenced by the skill base and socio-economic status of the residents as well as the industries and employment opportunities present in the region.

When viewed in conjunction with [Residents Place of Work](#) data and [Method of Travel to Work](#), industry sector statistics provide insights into the relationship between the economic and residential role of the area.

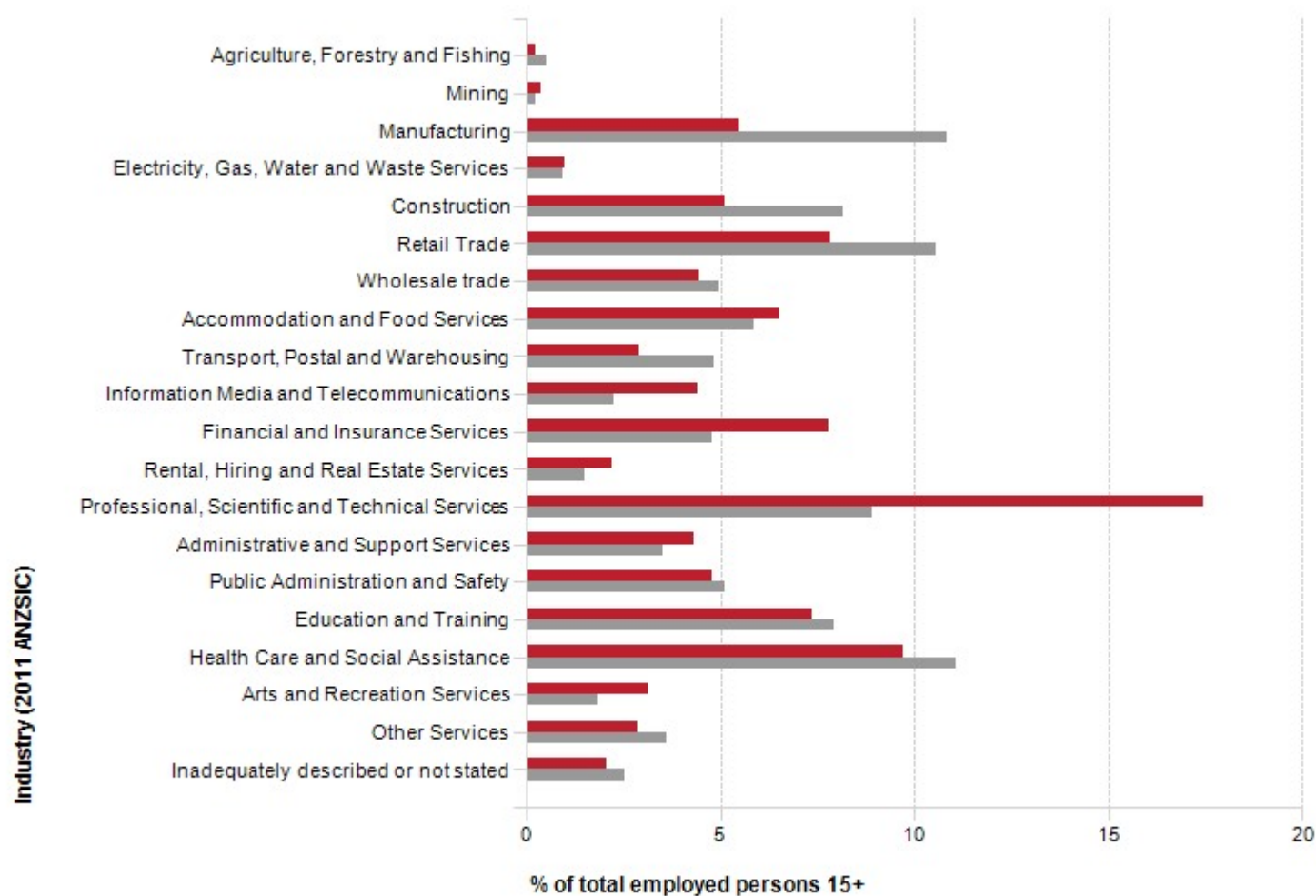

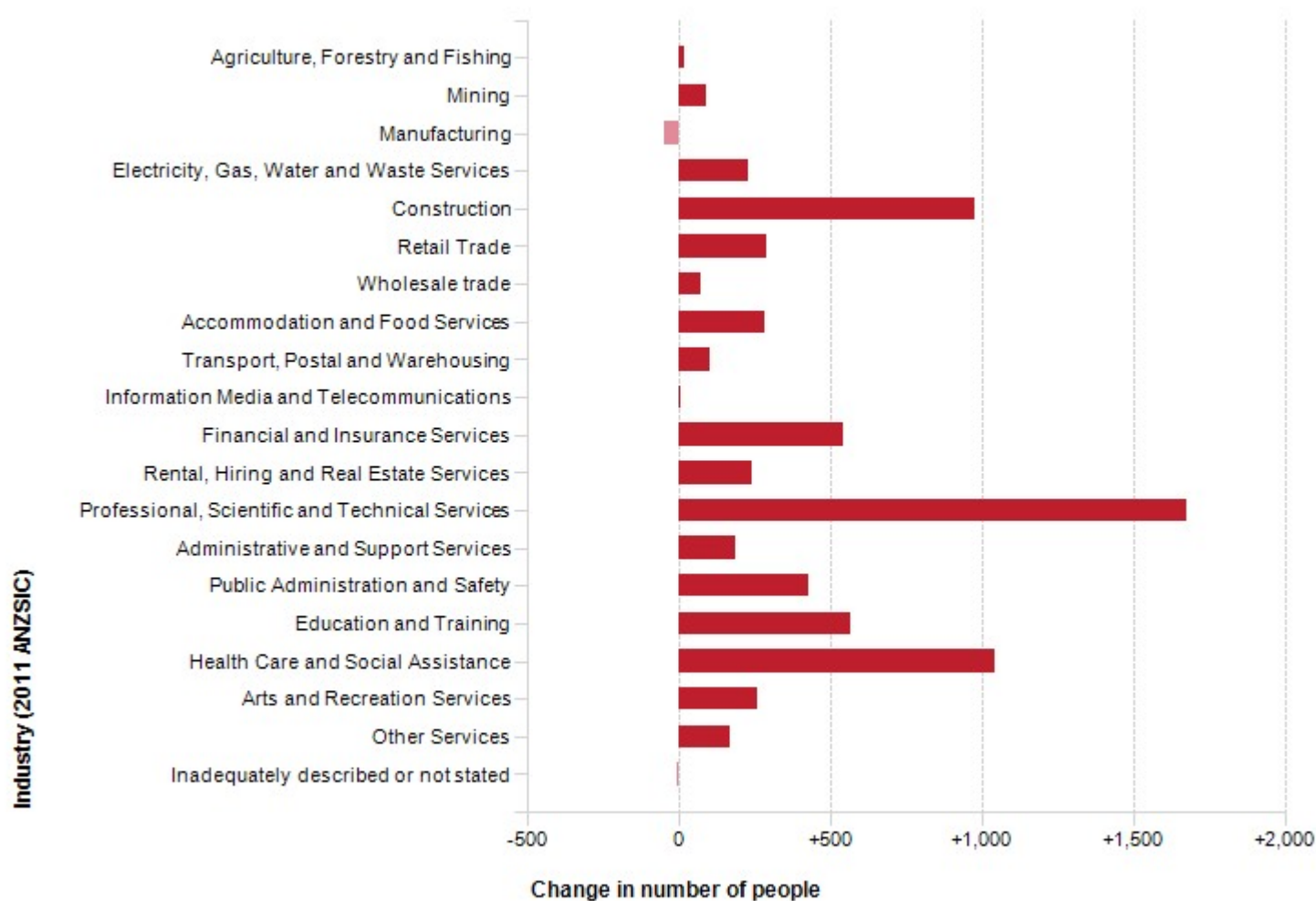

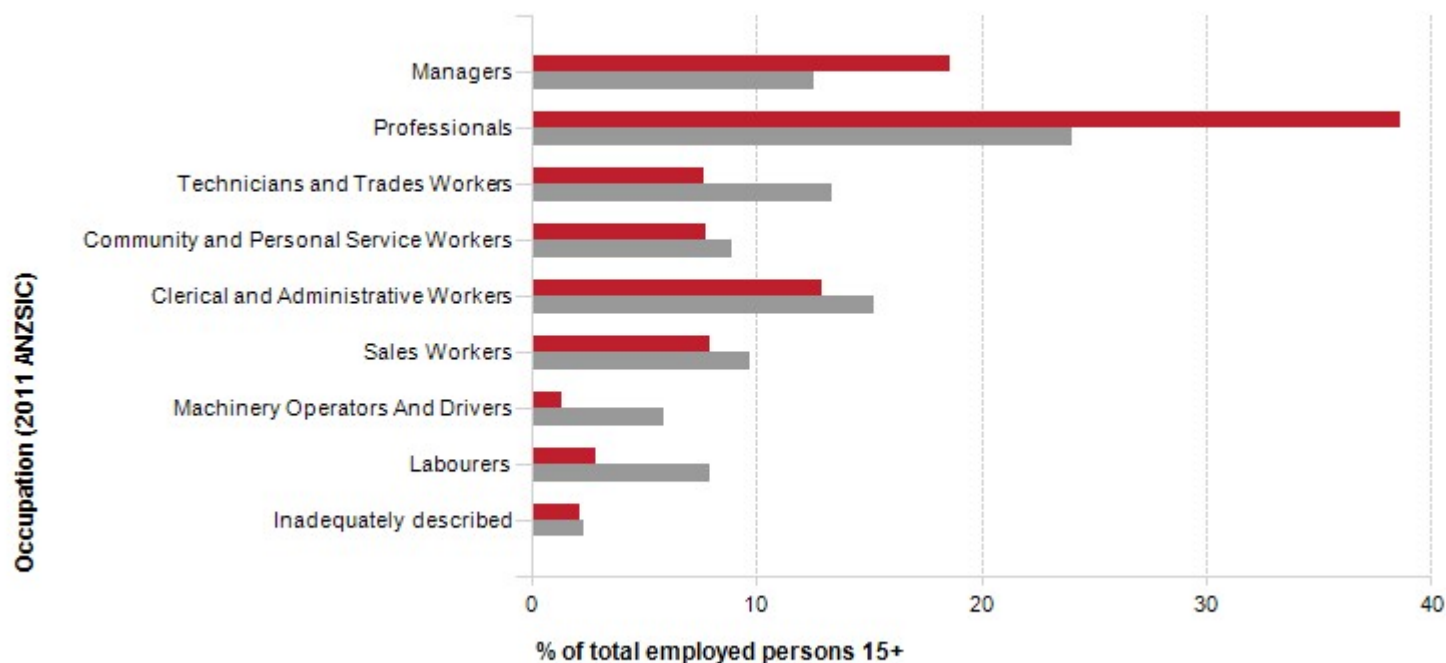

City of Port Phillip Greater Melbourne

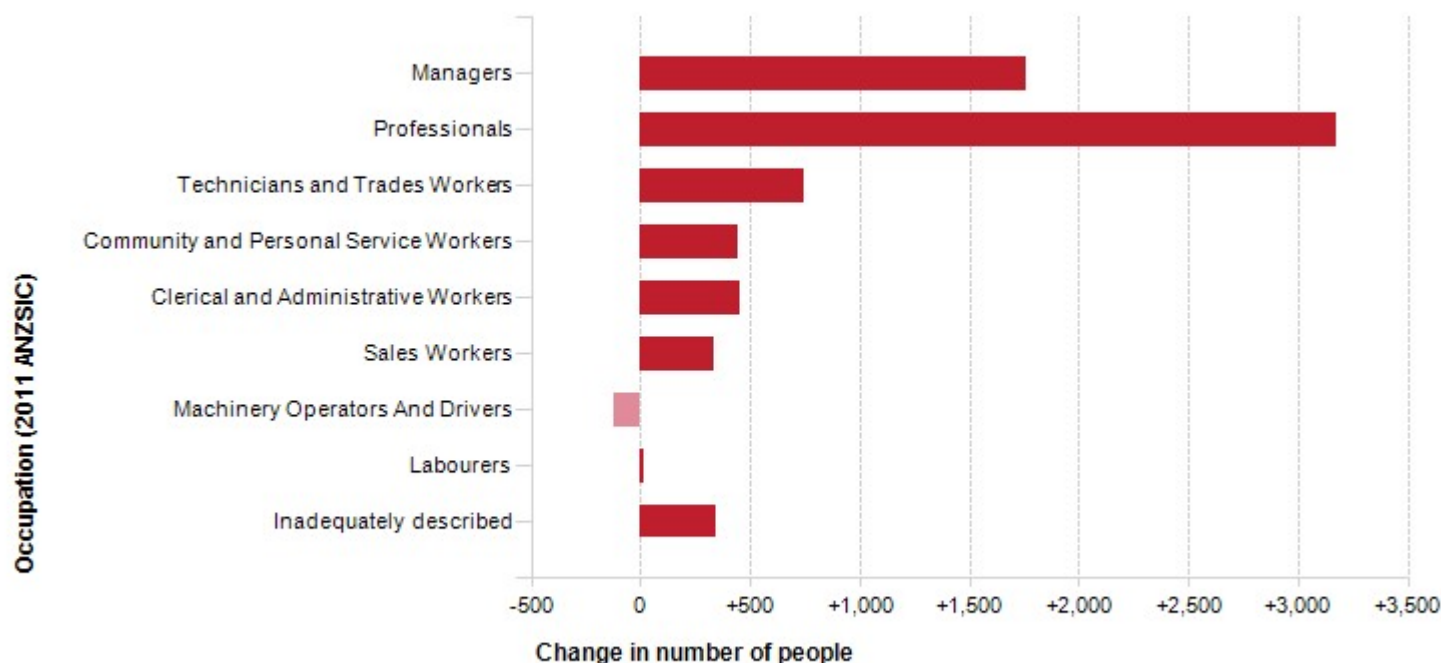

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## Dominant groups

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An analysis of the jobs held by the resident population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 shows the three most popular occupations were:

- Professionals (21,245 people or 38.7%)
- Managers (10,215 people or 18.6%)
- Clerical and Administrative Workers (7,118 people or 13.0%)

In combination these three occupations accounted for 38,578 people in total or 70.2% of the employed resident population.

In comparison, Greater Melbourne employed 24.1% in Professionals; 12.5% in Managers; and 15.3% in Clerical and Administrative Workers.

The major differences between the jobs held by the population of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons employed as Professionals (38.7% compared to 24.1%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons employed as Managers (18.6% compared to 12.5%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons employed as Technicians and Trades Workers (7.7% compared to 13.4%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons employed as Labourers (2.9% compared to 8.0%)

## Emerging groups

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The number of employed people in City of Port Phillip increased by 7,131 between 2006 and 2011.

The largest changes in the occupations of residents between 2006 and 2011 in City of Port Phillip were for those employed as:

- Professionals (+3,171 persons)
- Managers (+1,755 persons)
- Technicians and Trades Workers (+748 persons)
- Clerical and Administrative Workers (+449 persons)

## Method of travel to work

City of Port Phillip's commuting statistics reveal the main modes of transport by which residents get to work. There are a number of reasons why people use different modes of transport to get to work including the availability of affordable and effective public transport options, the number of motor vehicles available within a household, and the distance travelled to work.

Commuting data is very useful in transport planning as it informs decision-makers about the availability, effectiveness and utilisation of local transport options, particularly when analysed with [Residents Place of Work](#) data and [Car Ownership](#).

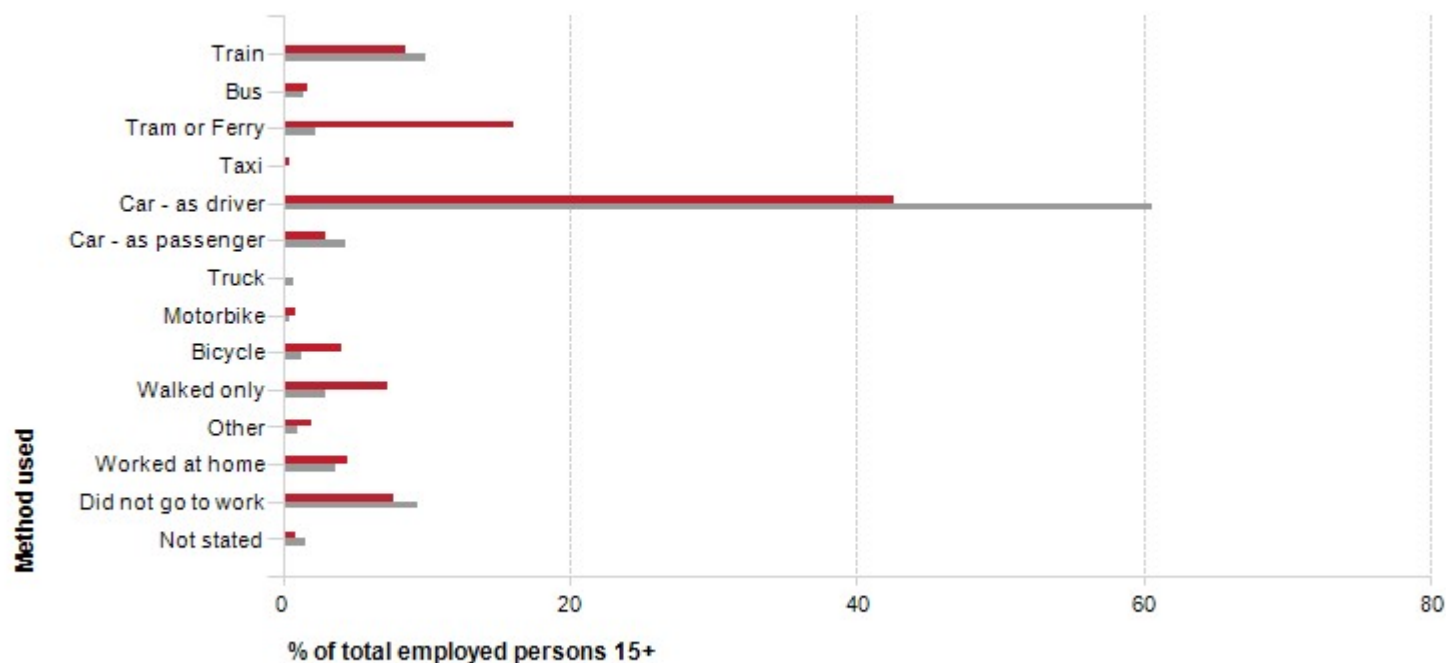

City of Port Phillip Greater Melbourne

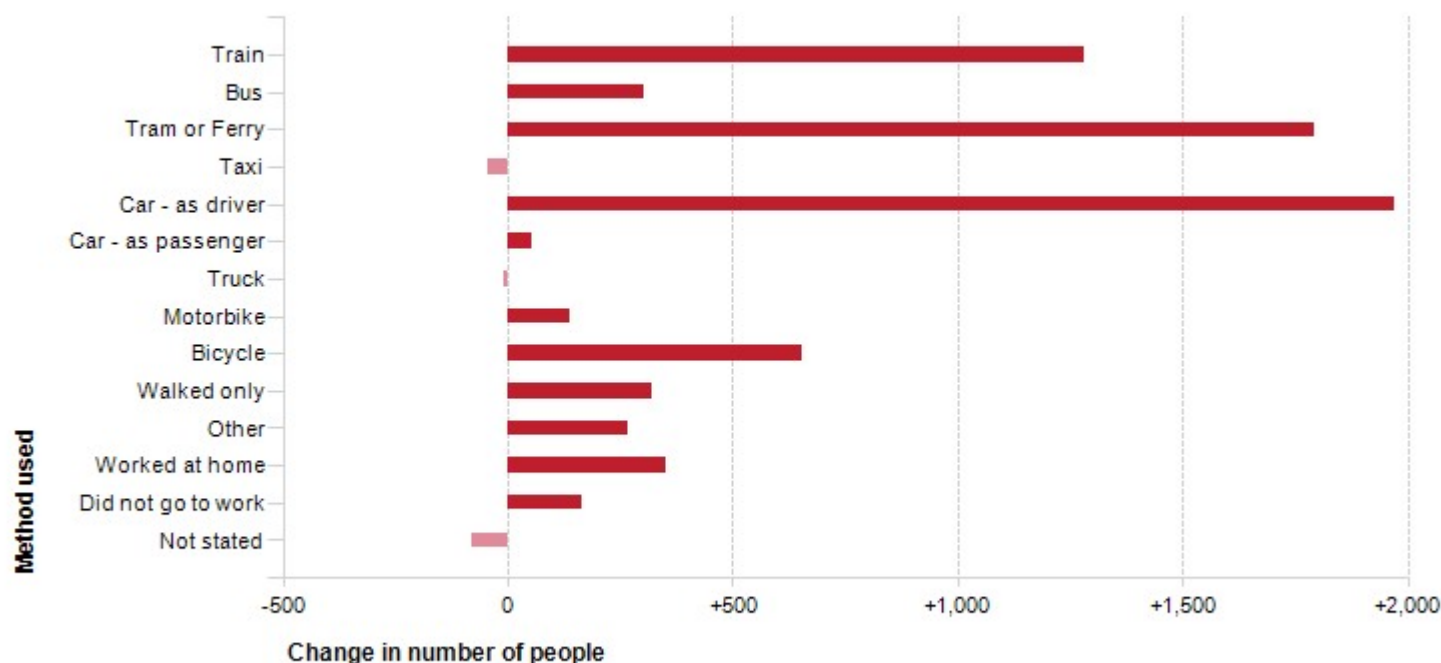

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## Dominant groups

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In 2011, there were 14,444 people who caught public transport to work (train, bus, tram or ferry) in City of Port Phillip, compared with 25,717 who drove in private vehicles (car – as driver, car – as passenger, motorbike, or truck).

Analysis of the method of travel to work of the residents in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that 26.3% used public transport, while 46.8% used a private vehicle, compared with 13.8% and 66.1% respectively in Greater Melbourne.

The major differences between the method of travel to work of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons who travelled by tram or ferry (16.0% compared to 2.3%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons who walked only (7.3% compared to 2.9%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons who travelled by bicycle (4.1% compared to 1.3%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons who travelled by car (as driver) (42.6% compared to 60.6%)

## Emerging groups

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The number of employed people in City of Port Phillip increased by 7,157 between 2006 and 2011.

The largest changes in the method of travel to work by resident population in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were for those nominated:

- Car - as driver (+1,972 persons)
- Tram or Ferry (+1,792 persons)
- Train (+1,282 persons)
- Bicycle (+653 persons)

# Volunteer work

The voluntary work sector is an important part of Australia's economy. The level of volunteering can indicate the cohesiveness of the community and how readily individuals are able to contribute to that community. Factors impacting on the level of volunteering in City of Port Phillip include the Age Structure of the population, the level of Proficiency in English, Income and Education levels.

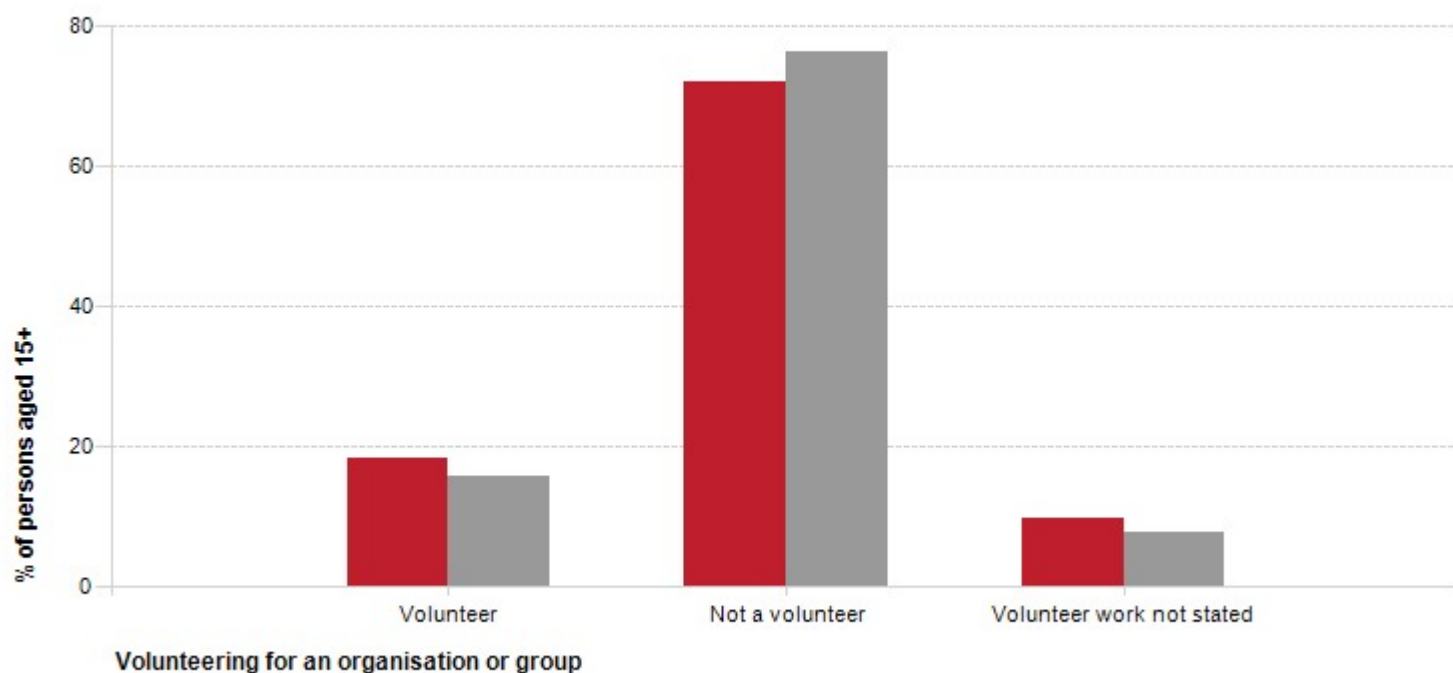

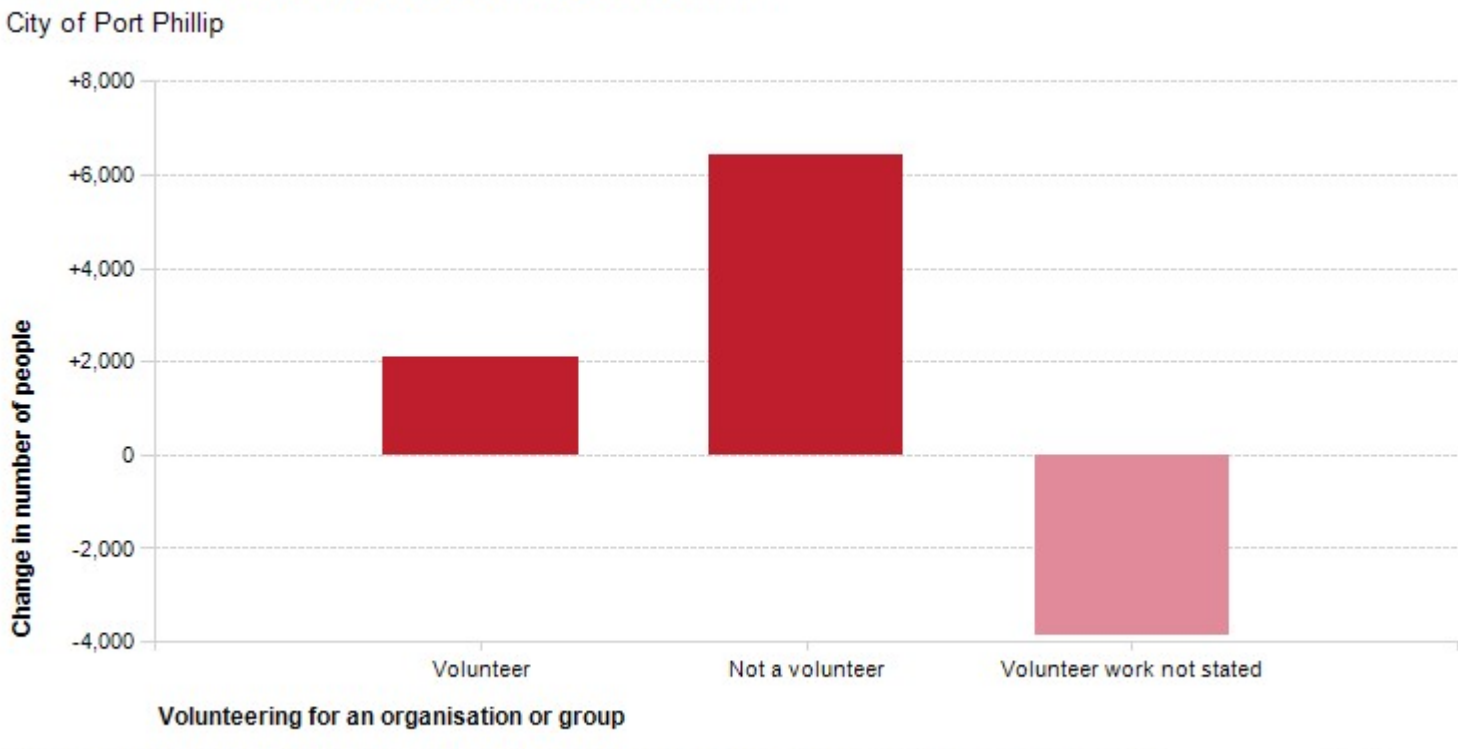
City of Port Phillip Greater Melbourne

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the voluntary work performed by the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a higher proportion of persons who volunteered for an organisation or group. Overall, 18.2% of the population reported performing voluntary work, compared with 15.8% for Greater Melbourne.

## Emerging groups

The number of volunteers in City of Port Phillip increased by 2,101 people between 2006 and 2011.

# Unpaid care

The proportion of people providing unpaid care for the aged and disabled in City of Port Phillip can be an important indicator of the level of demand for aged care services and facilities by local and state governments. An increasing proportion of carers among the population may indicate inadequate aged care provision, or the need for in-home support, or support for the carers themselves. The level of care provided by individuals is likely to be affected by Household Income, Age Structure and the ethnic makeup of the community (Language Spoken), as well as the sense of community cohesiveness.

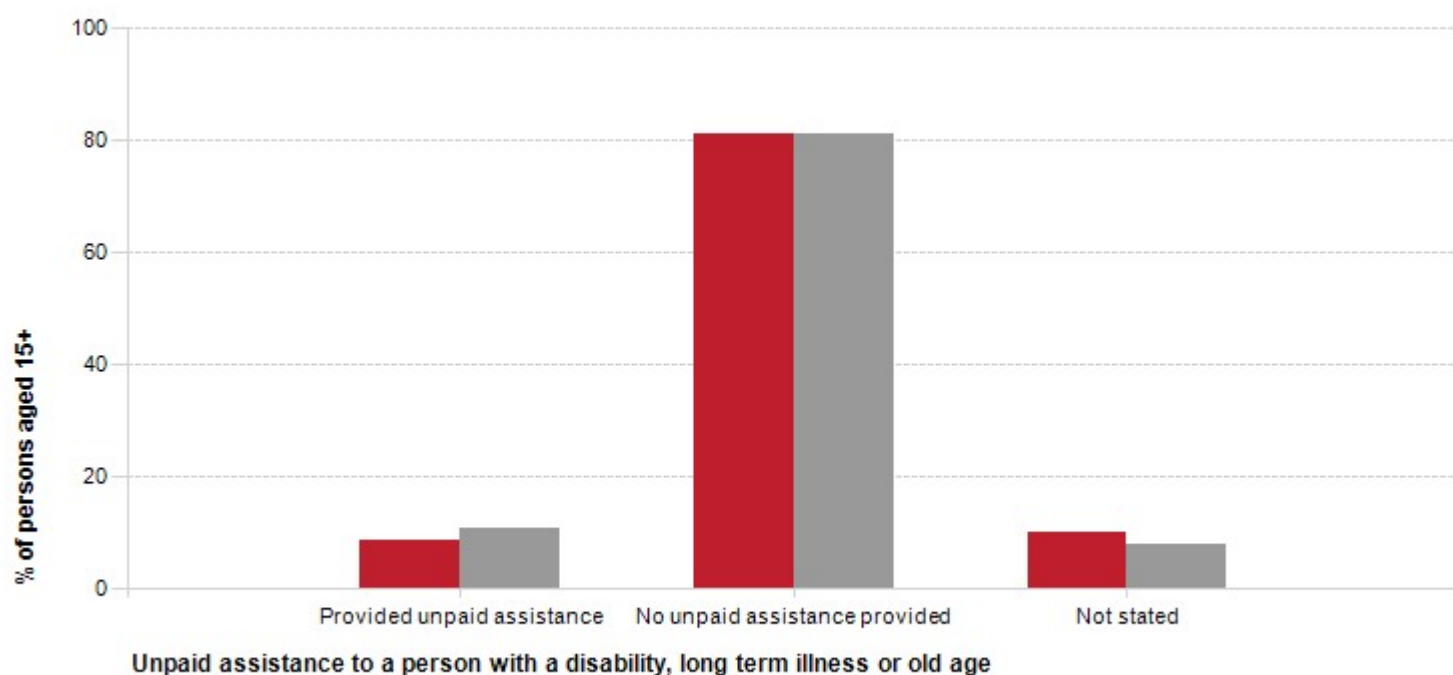

■ City of Port Phillip ■ Greater Melbourne

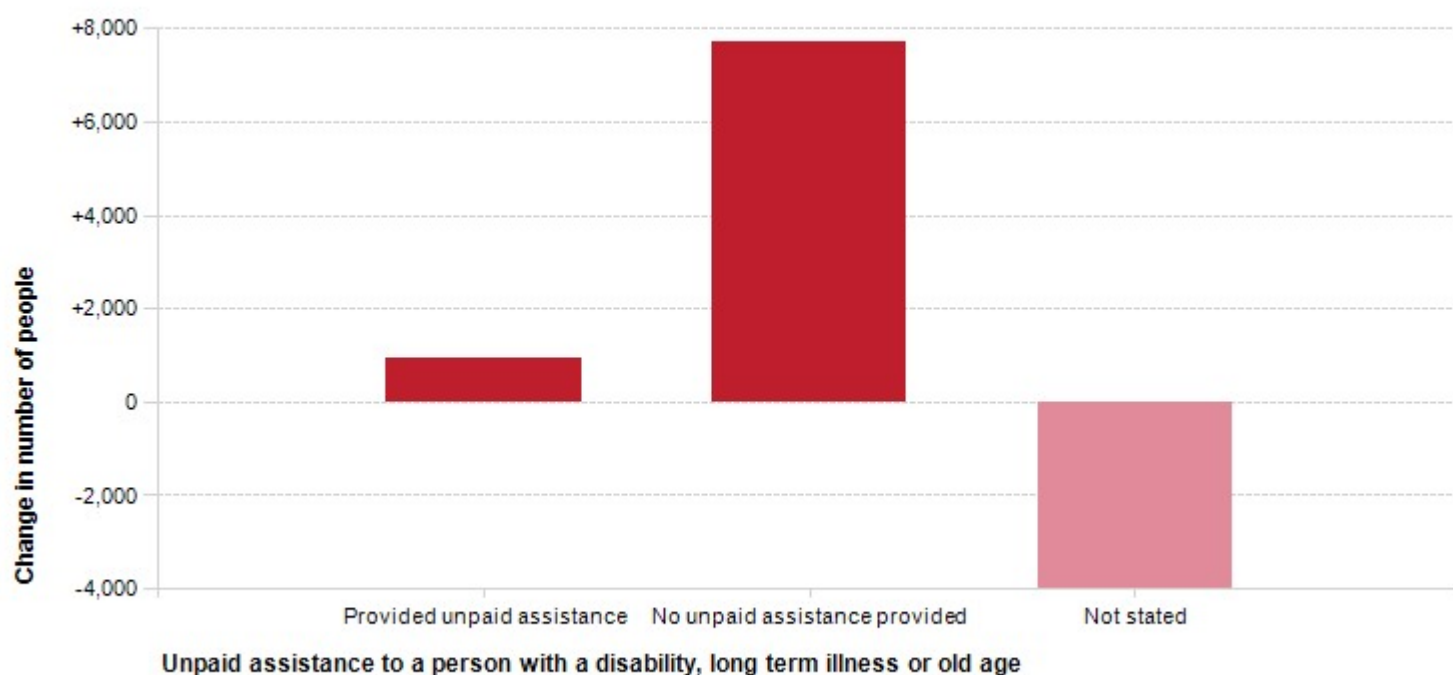

### Dominant groups

Analysis of the unpaid care provided by the population in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of persons who provided unpaid care either to family members or others.

Overall, 8.5% of the population provided unpaid care, compared with 10.9% for Greater Melbourne.

### Emerging groups

The number of people who provided unpaid assistance to a person with a disability, long term illness or old age in City of Port Phillip increased by 951 people between 2006 and 2011.

# Individual income

Individual Income statistics are an indicator of socio-economic status. With other data sources, such as [Household Income](#), [Educational Qualifications](#) and [Occupation](#), they help tell the story of the economic opportunities and socio-economic status of City of Port Phillip. The amount of income an individual receives is linked to a number of factors including [employment status](#), [age](#) (as for instance students and retirees often receive a lower income), qualifications and type of employment.

## Dominant groups

Analysis of individual income levels in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a higher proportion of persons earning a high income (those earning \$1,500 per week or more) and a lower proportion of low income persons (those earning less than \$400 per week).

Overall, 26.3% of the population earned a high income, and 21.8% earned a low income, compared with 12.9% and 35.8% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

**The major differences between City of Port Phillip's individual incomes and Greater Melbourne's individual incomes were:**

- A *larger* percentage of persons who earned \$2000 or more (15.8% compared to 6.5%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons who earned \$1500-\$1999 (10.5% compared to 6.4%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons who earned \$1250-\$1499 (8.2% compared to 5.8%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons who earned \$1000-\$1249 (10.0% compared to 8.3%)

# Household income

Households form the common 'economic unit' in our society. City of Port Phillip's Household Income is one of the most important indicators of socio-economic status. With other data sources, such as [Educational Qualifications](#) and [Occupation](#), it helps to reveal the economic opportunities and socio-economic status of City of Port Phillip. It is important to note that income data is not necessarily a measure of wealth. For example, if an area has a large number of retirees this will produce a higher proportion of households with low income but the retirees may have large capital wealth. For this reason, household income should be viewed in conjunction with [Age](#) and [Household Composition](#).

## Dominant groups

Analysis of household income levels in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a larger proportion of high income households (those earning \$2,500 per week or more) and a lower proportion of low income households (those earning less than \$600 per week).

Overall, 30.6% of the households earned a high income, and 16.0% were low income households, compared with 19.4% and 19.2% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

**The major differences between the household incomes of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:**

- A *larger* percentage of households who earned \$2500-\$2999 (13.8% compared to 8.4%)
- A *larger* percentage of households who earned \$3000-\$3499 (6.0% compared to 4.9%)
- A *larger* percentage of households who earned \$3500-\$3999 (3.5% compared to 2.4%)
- A *smaller* percentage of households who earned \$400-\$599 (5.5% compared to 8.1%)

# Households summary

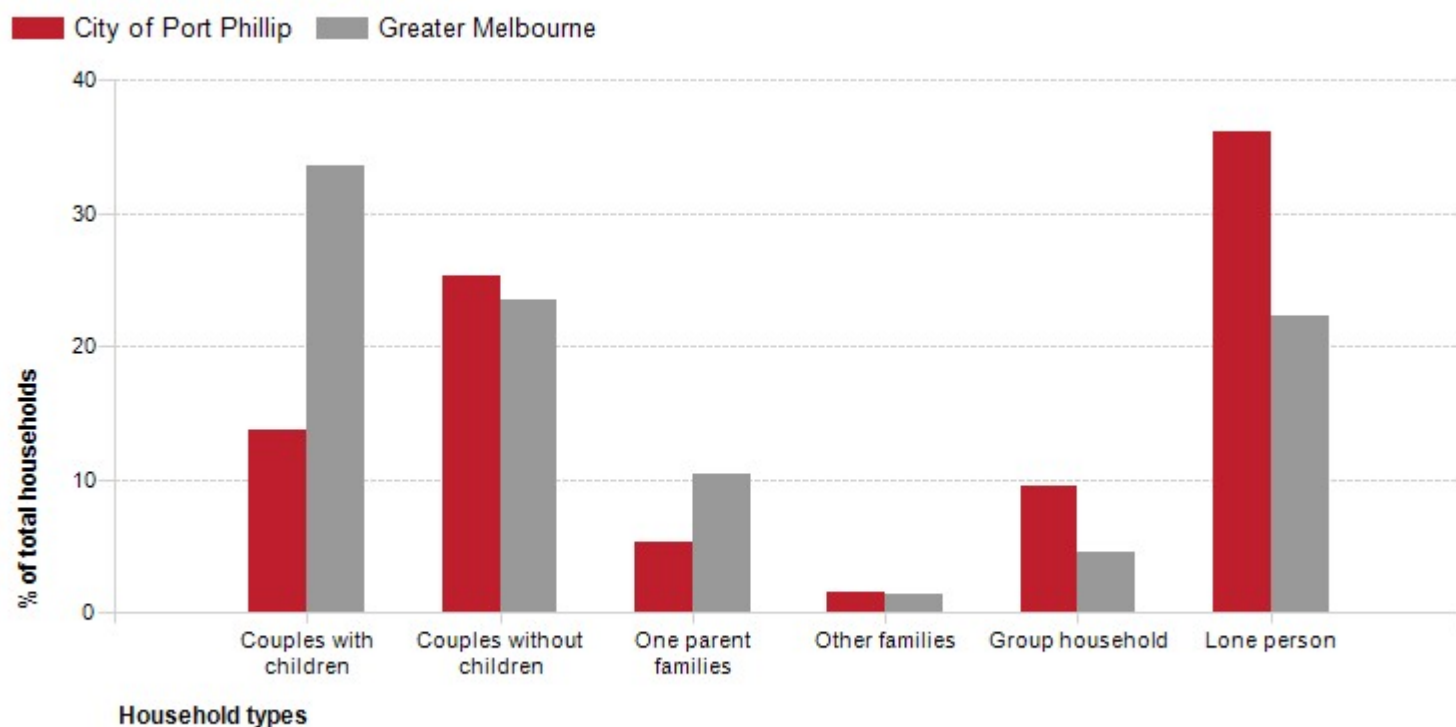

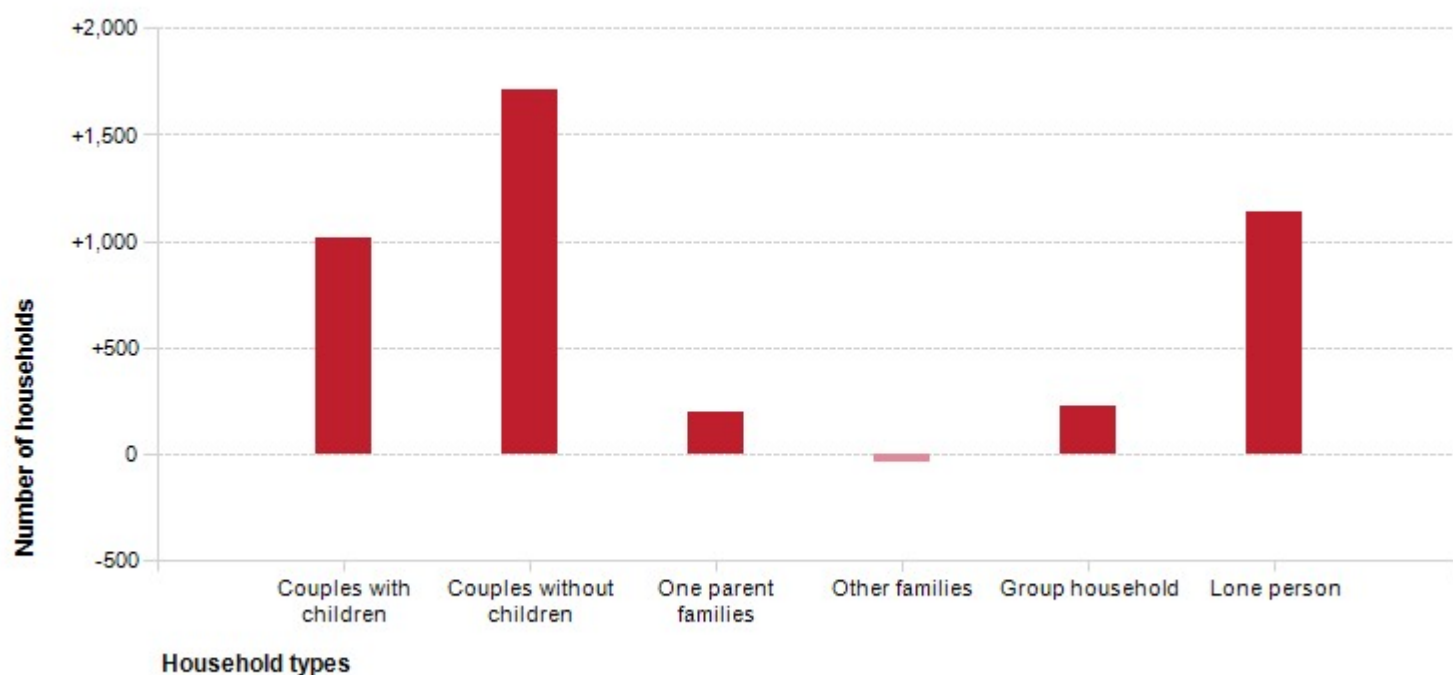
## Household types, 2011

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the household/family types in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of couple families with child(ren) as well as a lower proportion of one-parent families. Overall, 13.7% of total families were couple families with child(ren), and 5.3% were one-parent families, compared with 33.6% and 10.4% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

There were a higher proportion of lone person households and a higher proportion of couples without children. Overall, the proportion of lone person households was 36.1% compared to 22.3% in Greater Melbourne while the proportion of couples without children was 25.2% compared to 23.5% in Greater Melbourne.

## Emerging groups

The number of households in City of Port Phillip increased by 2,278 between 2006 and 2011.

The largest changes in family/household types in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were:

- Couples without children (+1,708 households)
- Lone person (+1,134 households)
- Couples with children (+1,018 households)

## Household size

The size of households in general follows the life-cycle of families. Households are usually small at the stage of relationship formation (early marriage), and then increase in size with the advent of children. They later reduce in size again as these children reach adulthood and leave home. Household size can also be influenced by a lack (or abundance) of affordable housing. Overseas migrants and indigenous persons often have a tradition of living with extended family members which significantly affects household size.

Household size in Australia has declined since the 1970s but between 2006 and 2011, the average household size remained stable for the nation as a whole.

An increasing household size in an area may indicate a lack of affordable housing opportunities for young people, an increase in the birth rate or an increase in family formation in the area. A declining household size may indicate children leaving the area when they leave home, an increase in retirees settling in the area, or an attraction of young singles and couples to the area.

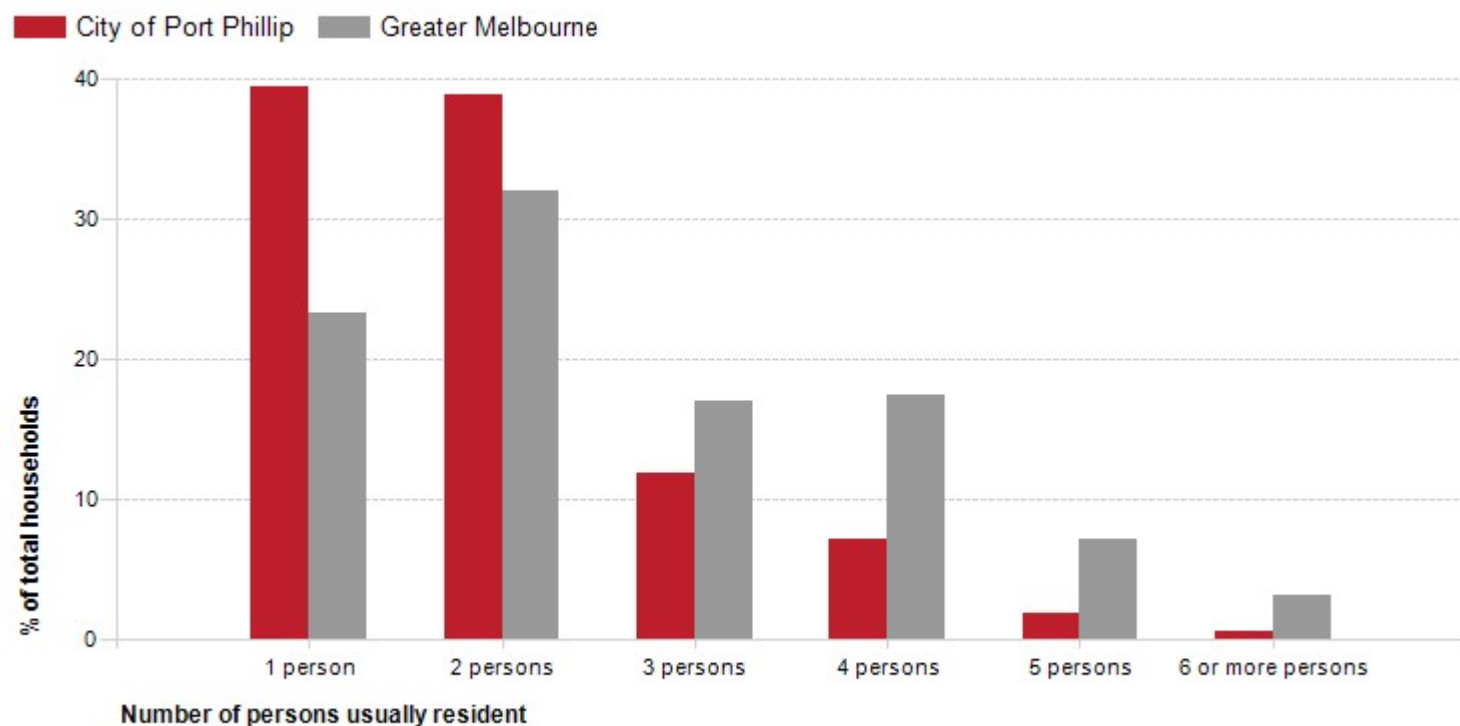

## Household size, 2011

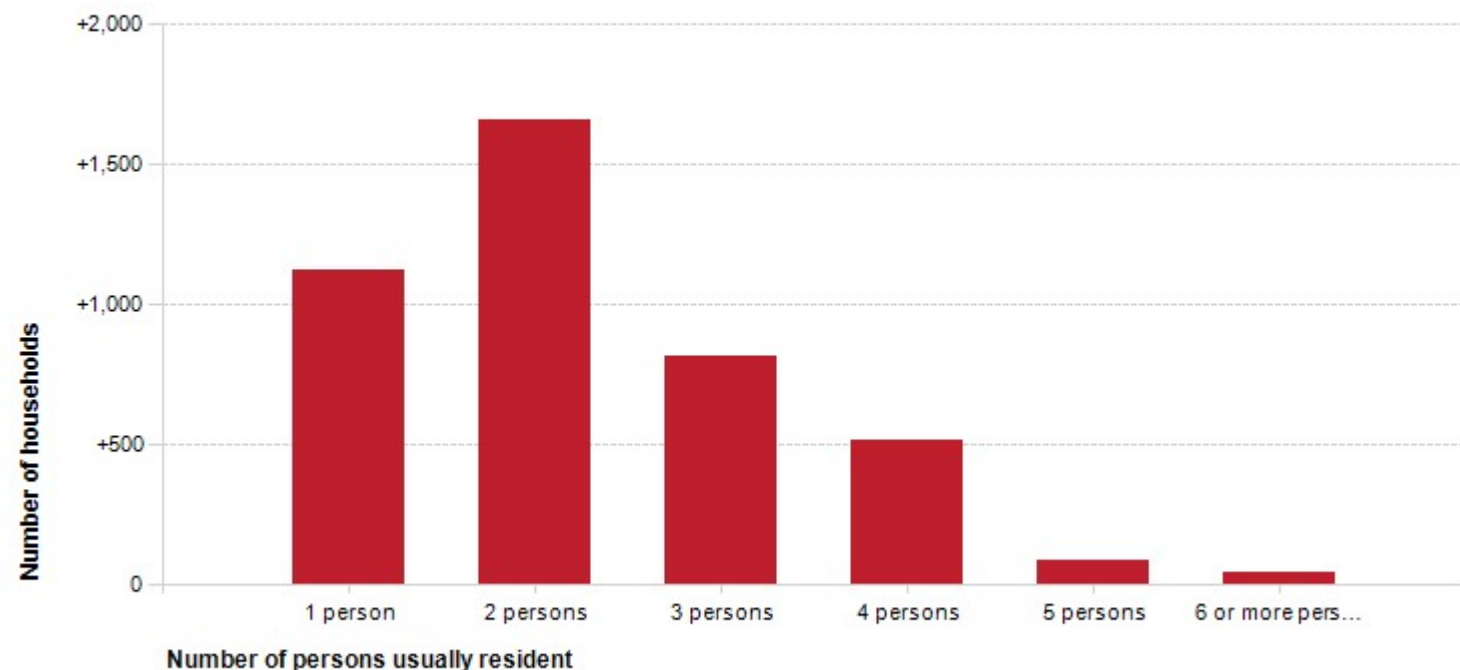

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the number of persons usually resident in a household in City of Port Phillip compared with Greater Melbourne shows that there were a higher proportion of lone person households, and a lower proportion of larger households (those with 4 persons or more). Overall there were 39.4% of lone person households, and 9.7% of larger households, compared with 23.3% and 27.8% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

The major differences in the household size for City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of households with 1 person usually resident (39.4% compared to 23.3%)
- A *larger* percentage of households with 2 persons usually resident (39.0% compared to 32.0%)
- A *smaller* percentage of households with 4 persons usually resident (7.2% compared to 17.4%)
- A *smaller* percentage of households with 5 persons usually resident (1.9% compared to 7.2%)

## Dwelling type

Dwelling Type is an important determinant of City of Port Phillip's residential role and function. A greater concentration of higher density dwellings is likely to attract more young adults and smaller households, often renting. Larger, detached or separate dwellings are more likely to attract families and prospective families. The residential built form often reflects market opportunities or planning policy, such as building denser forms of housing around public transport nodes or employment centres.

Dwelling Type statistics should be viewed in conjunction with [Household size](#), [Household Types](#), [Housing Tenure](#) and [Age Structure](#) for a more complete picture of the housing market in City of Port Phillip.

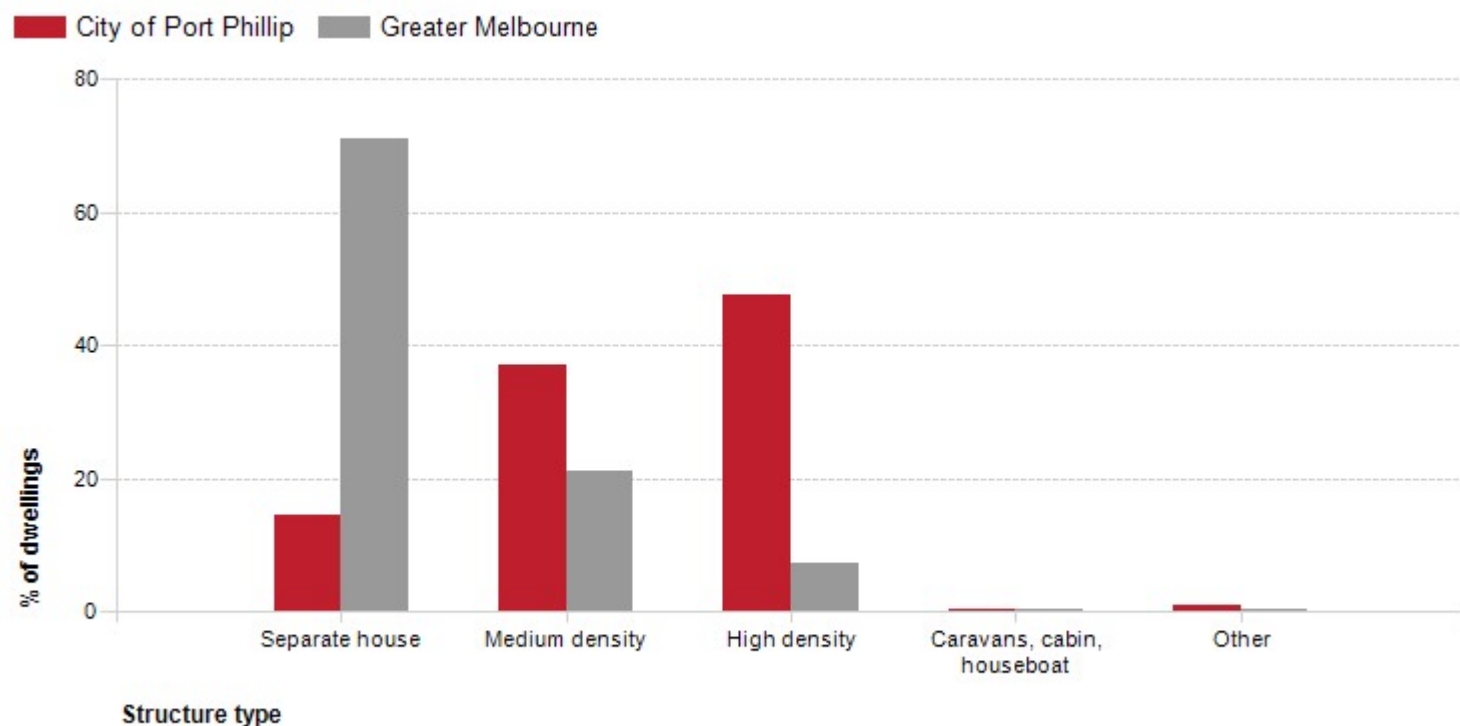

## Dwelling structure, 2011

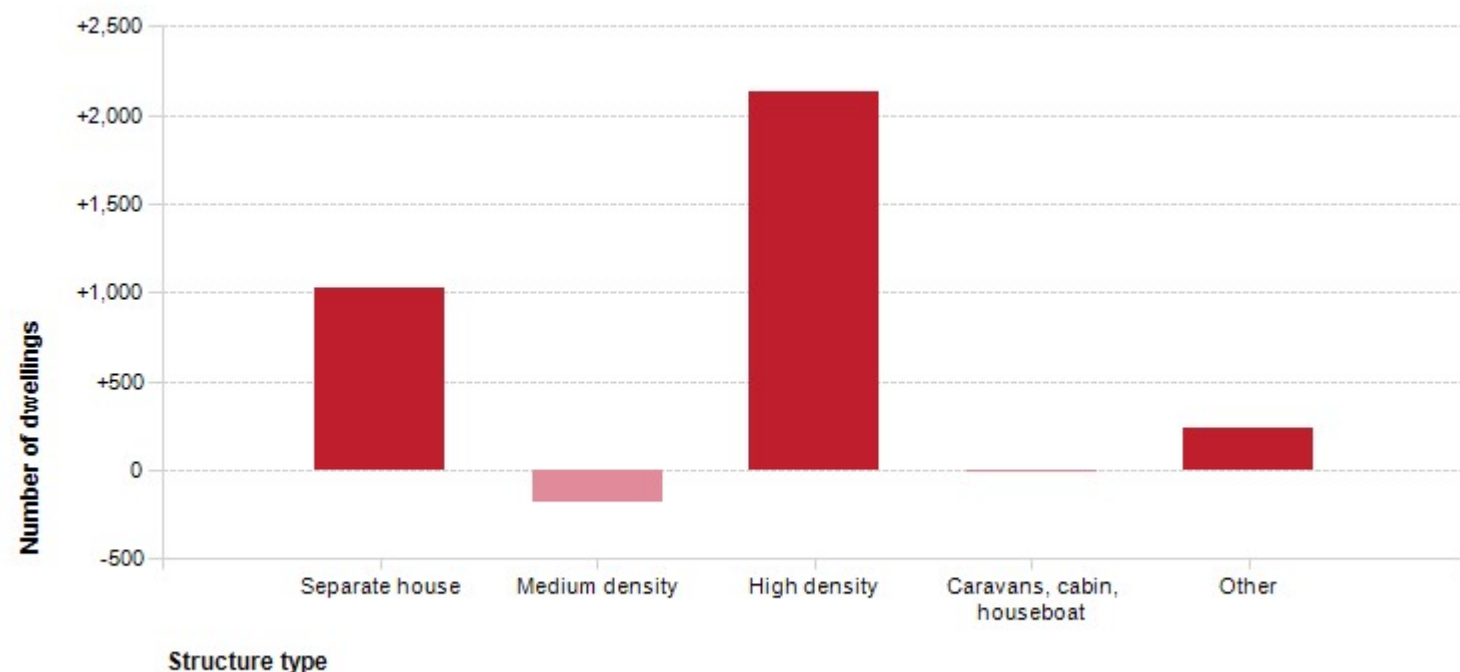

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## Dominant groups

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In 2011, there were 7,569 separate houses in the area, 19,312 medium density dwellings, and 24,925 high density dwellings.

Analysis of the types of dwellings in City of Port Phillip in 2011 shows that 14.5% of all dwellings were separate houses; 36.9% were medium density dwellings, and 47.7% were high density dwellings, compared with 71.1%, 21.1%, and 7.2% in the Greater Melbourne respectively.

In 2011, a total of 87.8% of the dwellings in City of Port Phillip were occupied on Census night, compared to 91.2% in Greater Melbourne. The proportion of unoccupied dwellings was 12.0%, which is larger compared to that found in Greater Melbourne (8.6%).

## Emerging groups

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The total number of dwellings in City of Port Phillip increased by 3,194 between 2006 and 2011.

The largest changes in the type of dwellings found in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were:

- High density (+2,134 dwellings)

## Number of bedrooms per dwelling

The Number of Bedrooms in a dwelling is an indicator of the size of dwellings, and when combined with dwelling type information, provides insight into the role City of Port Phillip plays in the housing market. For example, an area of high density dwellings that are predominantly 1-2 bedroom are likely to attract students, single workers and young couples, whereas a high density area with dwellings that are predominantly 2-3 bedroom may attract more empty nesters and some families.

In combination with Household type and Household size, the Number of Bedrooms can also indicate issues around housing affordability, overcrowding and other socio-economic factors.

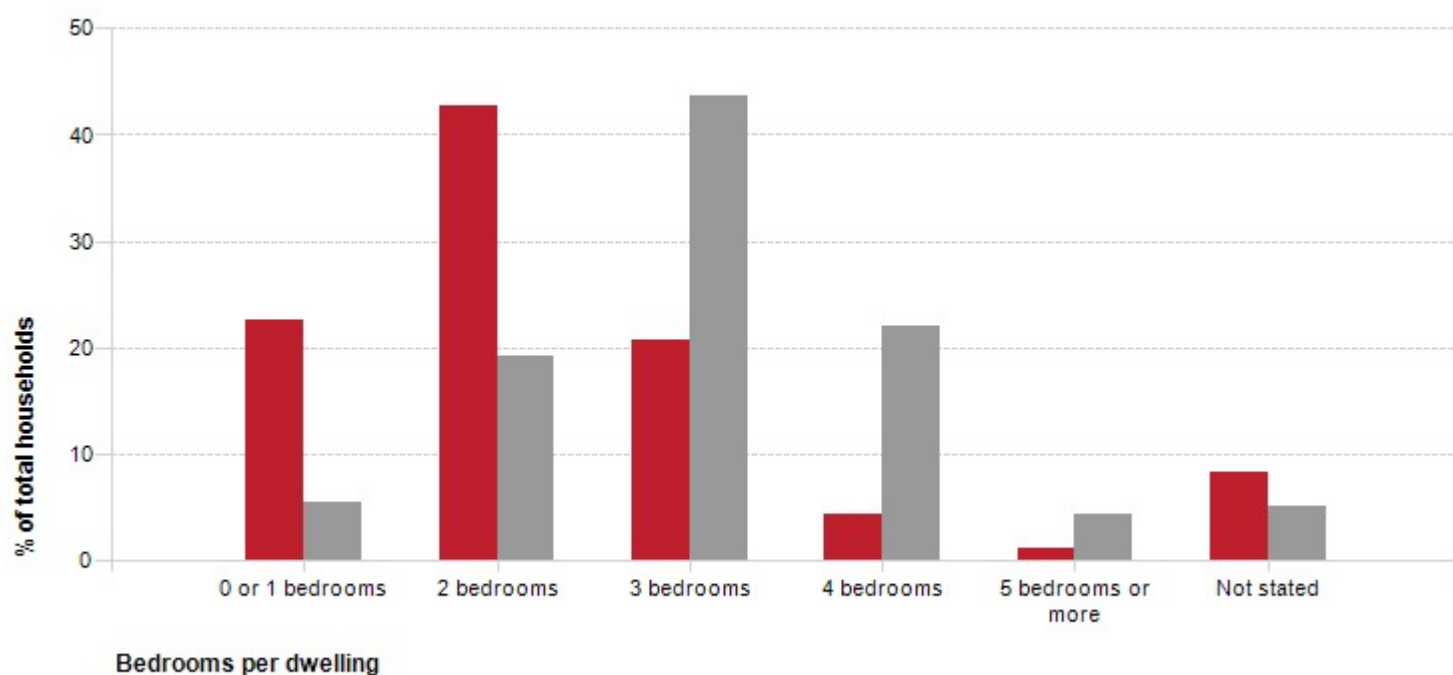

■ City of Port Phillip ■ Greater Melbourne

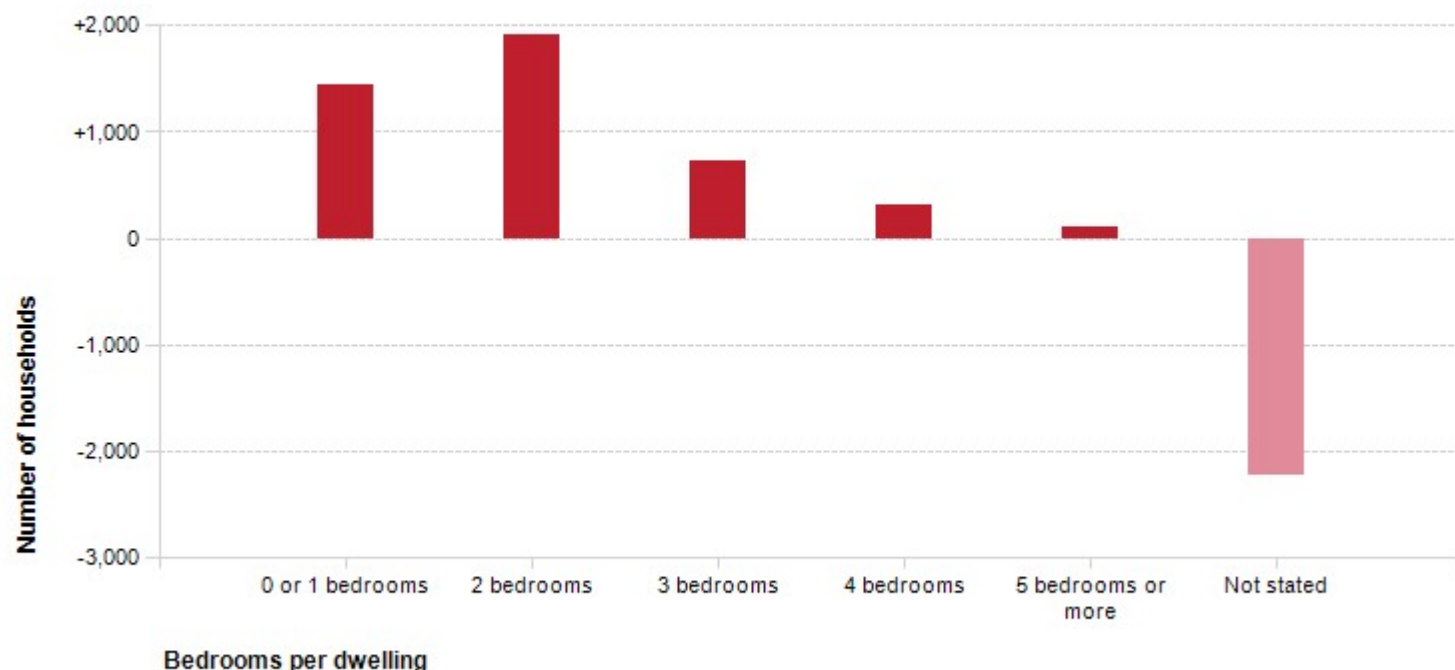

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the number of bedrooms in dwellings in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a higher proportion of dwellings with 1 and 2 bedrooms, and a lower proportion of dwellings with 4 or more bedrooms.

Overall, 65.5% of households were in 1-2 bedroom dwellings, and 5.5% of 4-plus bedroom dwellings, compared with 24.8% and 26.3% for Greater Melbourne respectively.

The major differences between the number of bedrooms per dwelling of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:

- A *larger* percentage of 2 bedroom dwellings (42.8% compared to 19.3%)
- A *larger* percentage of dwellings with no bedrooms (includes bedsitters) (22.7% compared to 5.5%)
- A *smaller* percentage of 3 bedroom dwellings (20.7% compared to 43.8%)
- A *smaller* percentage of 4 bedroom dwellings (4.4% compared to 22.0%)

## Emerging groups

The largest changes in the number of bedrooms per dwelling in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were:

- 2 bedrooms (+1,917 dwellings)
- 0 or 1 bedrooms (+1,435 dwellings)
- 3 bedrooms (+721 dwellings)
- 4 bedrooms (+314 dwellings)

## Internet connection

A fast Internet Connection is increasingly required for accessing essential information and undertaking domestic and non-domestic business. Households with dial-up or no internet service are being left behind in the digital divide' as both government and the private sector are increasingly conducting their business, or aspects of it, on-line.

Internet connectivity in City of Port Phillip can be affected by availability of connection, Education, Household Income and Age Structure.

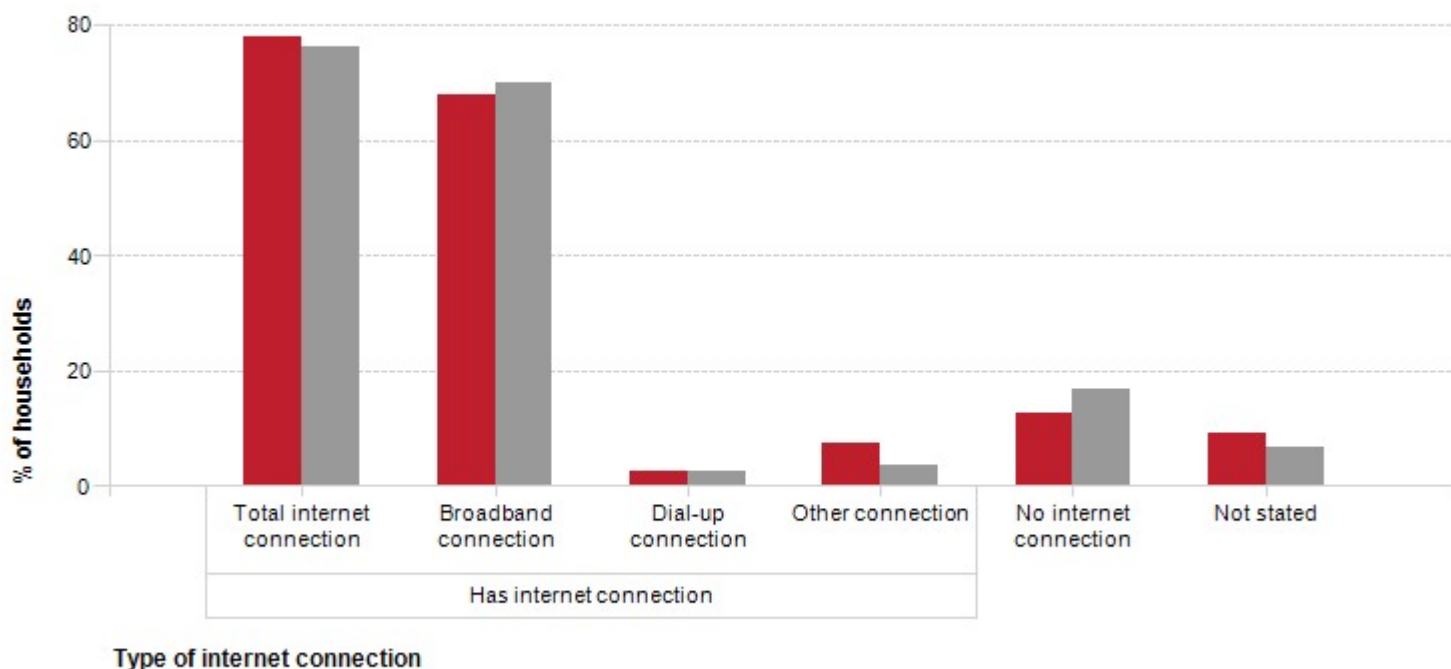

## Type of internet connection, 2011

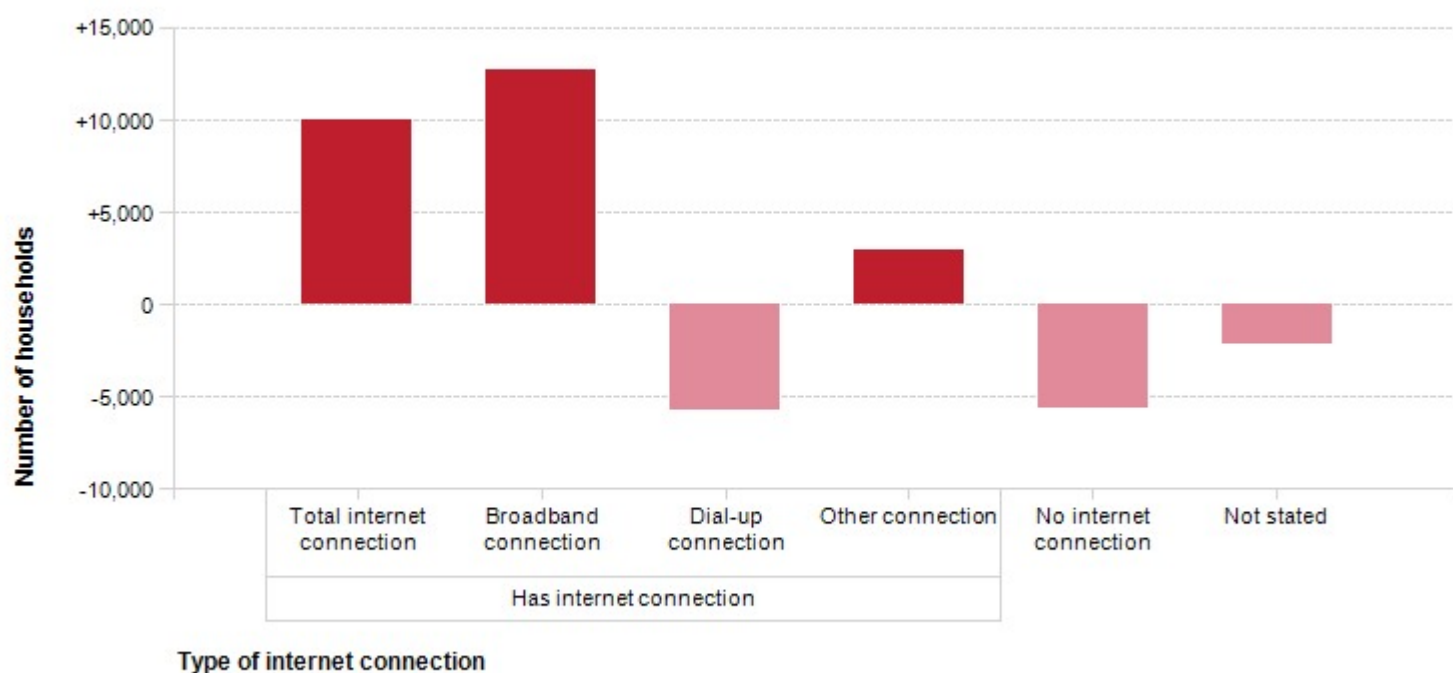

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the type of internet connection of households in City of Port Phillip compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a lower proportion of households with either no internet connection or a dial up connection, as well as a lower proportion of households with broadband connectivity.

Overall 15.3% of households had no internet connection or a dial up connection, and 68.0% had broadband connectivity, compared with 19.5% and 70.0% respectively in Greater Melbourne.

## Emerging groups

Between 2006 and 2011 the number of households with an internet connection increased by 10,025.

The largest changes in the internet connectivity in City of Port Phillip, between 2006 and 2011 were:

- Broadband connection (+12,769 households)
- Total internet connection (+10,025 households)
- Dial-up connection (-5,685 households)

# Number of cars per household

The ability of the population to access services and employment is strongly influenced by access to transport. The number of motor vehicles per household in City of Port Phillip quantifies access to private transport and will be influenced by Age Structure and Household Type, which determine the number of adults present; access to Public Transport; distance to shops, services, employment and education; and Household Income. Depending on these factors, car ownership can be seen as a measure of advantage or disadvantage, or a neutral socio-economic measure, which impacts on the environment and quality of life.

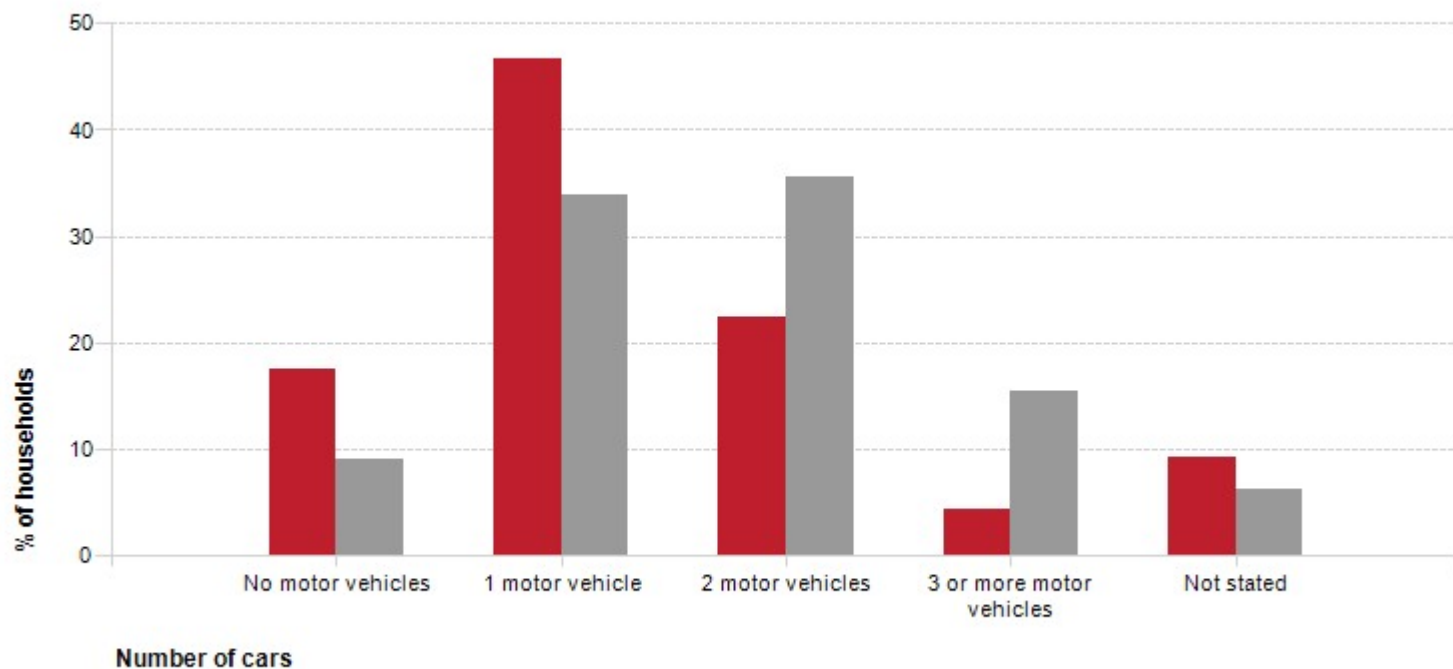

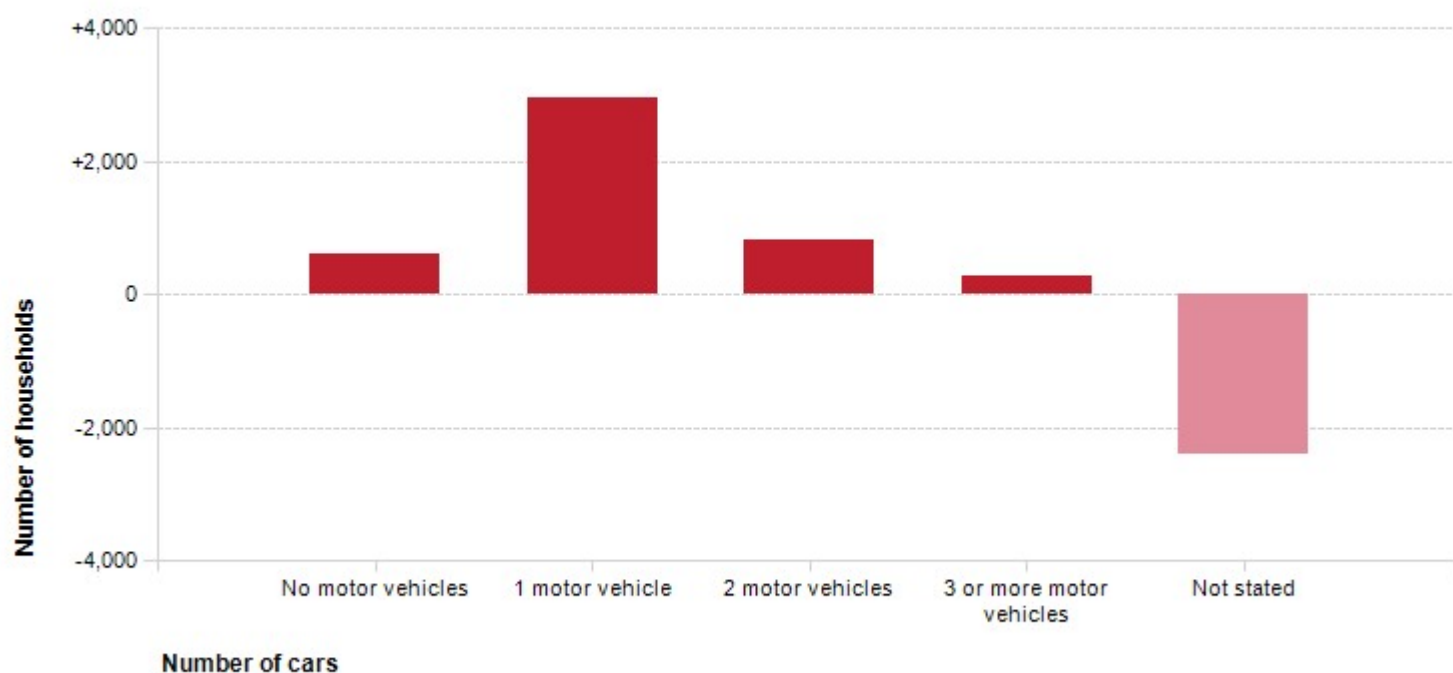

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the car ownership of the households in City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that 73.4% of the households owned at least one car, while 17.4% did not, compared with 84.8% and 9.0% respectively in Greater Melbourne.

Of those that owned at least one vehicle, there was a larger proportion who owned just one car; a smaller proportion who owned two cars; and a smaller proportion who owned three cars or more.

Overall, 46.6% of the households owned one car; 22.4% owned two cars; and 4.3% owned three cars or more, compared with 33.9%; 35.5% and 15.4% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

## Emerging groups

The largest changes in the household car ownership in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were:

- 1 motor vehicle (+2,968 households)
- 2 motor vehicles (+818 households)
- No motor vehicles (+608 households)
- 3 or more motor vehicles (+273 households)

# Housing tenure

City of Port Phillip's Housing Tenure data provides insights into its socio-economic status as well as the role it plays in the housing market. For example, a high concentration of private renters may indicate a transient area attractive to young singles and couples, while a concentration of home owners indicates a more settled area with mature families and empty-nester [Household Summary](#). Tenure can also reflect built form ([Dwelling Type](#)), with a significantly higher share of renters in high density housing and a substantially larger proportion of home-owners in separate houses, although this is not always the case.

In conjunction with other socio-economic status indicators in City of Port Phillip, Tenure data is useful for analysing housing markets, housing affordability and identifying public housing areas.

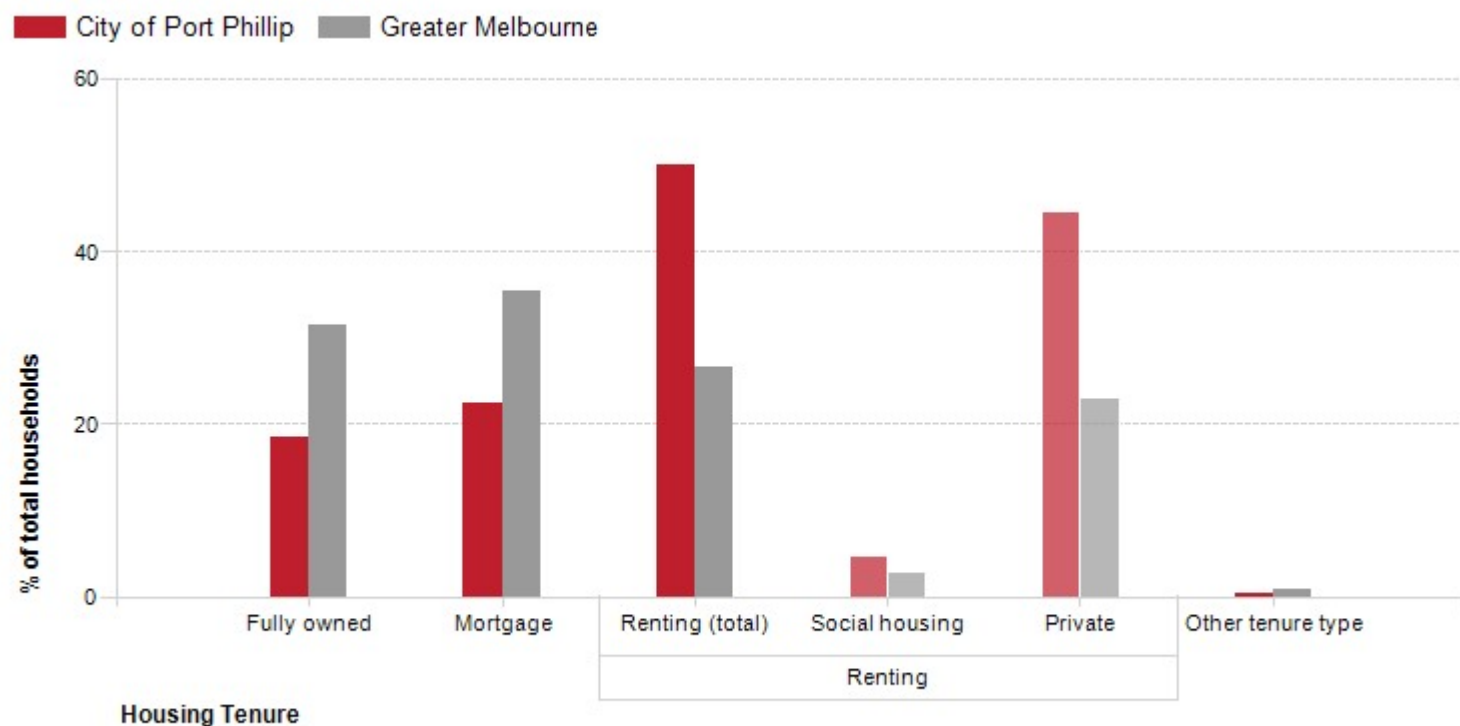

## Housing tenure, 2011

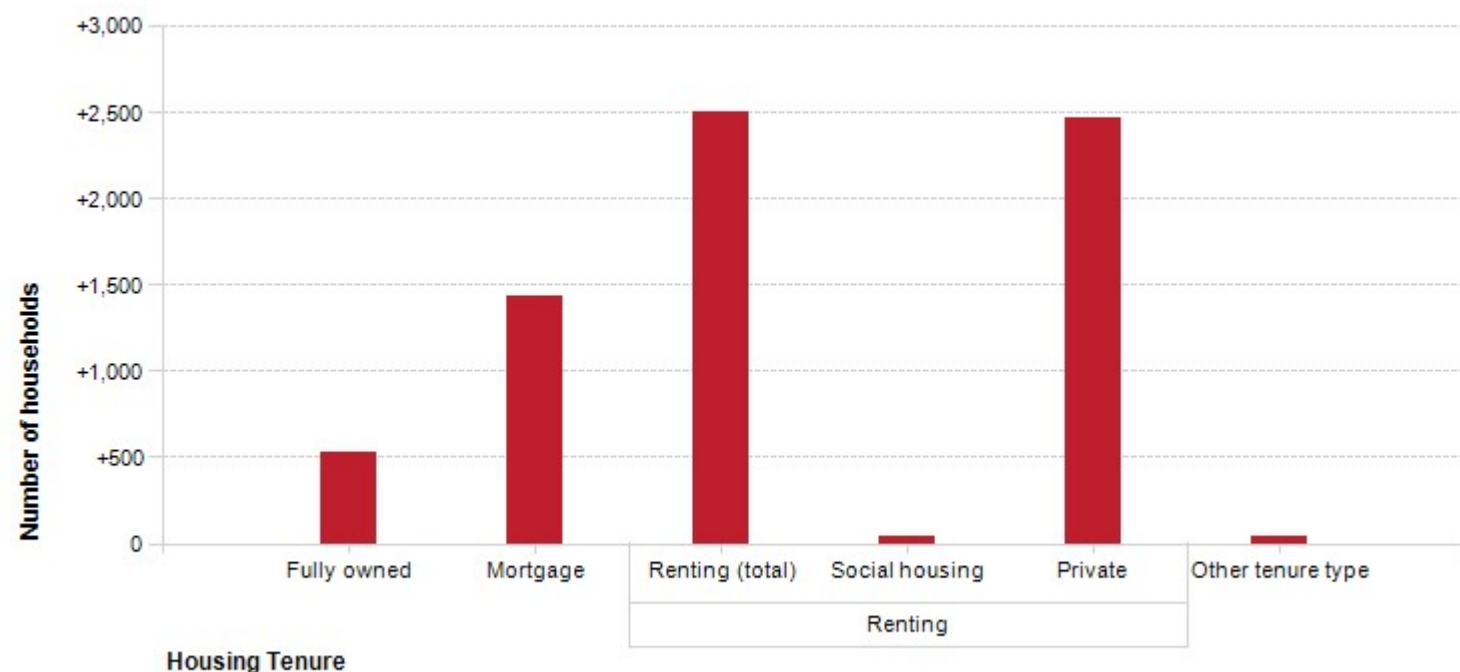

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## Dominant groups

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Analysis of the housing tenure of the population of City of Port Phillip in 2011 compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a smaller proportion of households who owned their dwelling; a smaller proportion purchasing their dwelling; and a larger proportion who were renters.

Overall, 18.4% of the population owned their dwelling; 22.4% were purchasing, and 50.1% were renting, compared with 31.5%, 35.3% and 26.5% respectively for Greater Melbourne.

## Emerging groups

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The largest changes in housing tenure categories for the households in City of Port Phillip between 2006 and 2011 were:

- Renting - Private (+2,470 persons)
- Mortgage (+1,437 persons)
- Fully owned (+531 persons)

The total number of households in City of Port Phillip increased by 2,275 between 2006 and 2011.

# Housing loan repayments

Mortgage repayments are directly related to house prices in City of Port Phillip, length of occupancy and the level of equity of home owners. When viewed with [Household Income](#) data it may also indicate the level of housing stress households in the community are under. In mortgage belt areas it is expected that households will be paying a higher proportion of their income on their housing compared to well-established areas. First home buyer areas are also likely to have larger mortgages than upgrader areas where households move in with equity from elsewhere.

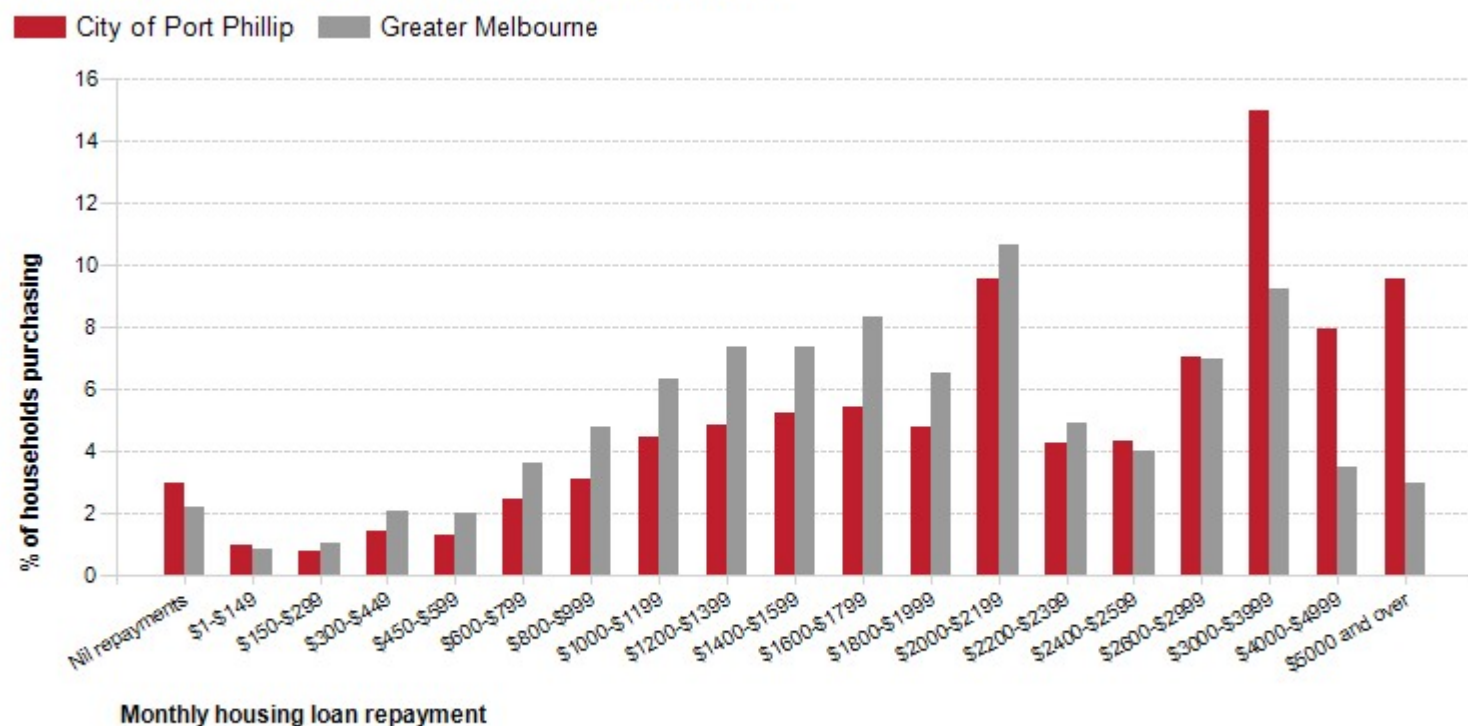

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the monthly housing loan repayments of households in City of Port Phillip compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a larger proportion of households paying high mortgage repayments (\$2,600 per month or more), and a smaller proportion of households with low mortgage repayments (less than \$1000 per month).

Overall, 39.6% of households were paying high mortgage repayments, and 12.9% were paying low repayments, compared with 22.6% and 16.5% respectively in Greater Melbourne.

**The major differences between the household loan repayments of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:**

- A *larger* percentage of \$5000 and over (9.6% compared to 3.0%)
- A *larger* percentage of \$3000-\$3999 (15.0% compared to 9.2%)
- A *larger* percentage of \$4000-\$4999 (8.0% compared to 3.5%)
- A *smaller* percentage of \$1600-\$1799 (5.4% compared to 8.3%)

# Housing rental payments

Rental payments can be a better measure of the cost of housing in City of Port Phillip than mortgage repayments because they are not contingent on length of occupancy or equity in the dwelling.

High rental payments may indicate desirable areas with mobile populations who prefer to rent, or a housing shortage, or gentrification. Low rental payments may indicate public housing (check [Tenure Type](#)), or areas where low income households move by necessity for a lower cost of living.

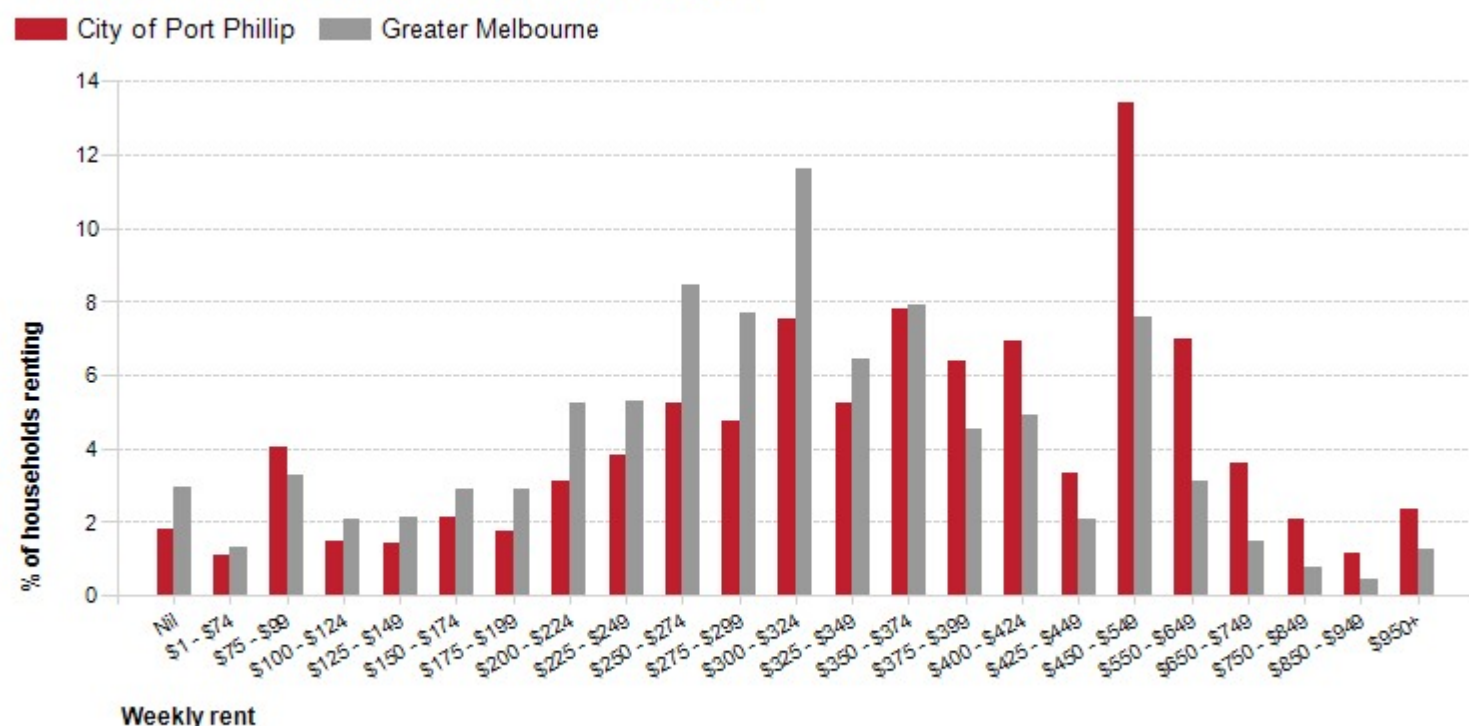

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the weekly housing rental payments of households in City of Port Phillip compared to Greater Melbourne shows that there was a larger proportion of households paying high rental payments (\$400 per week or more), and a smaller proportion of households with low rental payments (less than \$150 per week).

Overall, 39.8% of households were paying high rental payments, and 9.7% were paying low payments, compared with 21.7% and 11.7% respectively in Greater Melbourne.

**The major differences between the housing rental payments of City of Port Phillip and Greater Melbourne were:**

- A larger percentage of \$450 - \$549 (13.4% compared to 7.6%)
- A larger percentage of \$550 - \$649 (7.0% compared to 3.1%)
- A larger percentage of \$650 - \$749 (3.6% compared to 1.5%)
- A larger percentage of \$400 - \$424 (6.9% compared to 4.9%)

# SEIFA - disadvantage

City of Port Phillip SEIFA Index of Disadvantage measures the relative level of socio-economic disadvantage based on a range of Census characteristics. It is a good place to start to get a general view of the relative level of disadvantage in one area compared to others and is used to advocate for an area based on its level of disadvantage.

The index is derived from attributes that reflect disadvantage such as low income, low educational attainment, high unemployment, and jobs in relatively unskilled occupations. When targeting services to disadvantaged communities, it is important to also look at these underlying characteristics as they can differ markedly between areas with similar SEIFA scores and shed light on the type of disadvantage being experienced.

A higher score on the index means a *lower* level of disadvantage. A lower score on the index means a *higher* level of disadvantage.

## About the community profile

Demographic change across Australia is recorded by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) in the Census collections every five years. Population experts, .id, analyse and convert these raw figures into stories of place to inform council staff, community groups, investors, business, students and the general public.

City of Port Phillip Community Profile provides demographic analysis for the City and its suburbs based on results from the 2011, 2006, 2001, 1996 and 1991 Censuses of Population and Housing. The profile is updated with population estimates when the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) releases new figures such as the annual Estimated Resident Population (ERP).

Suburb boundaries and Census questions change over time, but .id manages the data to ensure that there is an accurate time series provided for the current geographic boundaries. You can read more about this in the [Geography Notes](#) section.

Results for City of Port Phillip include population, age structure, ethnicity, ancestry, religion, income, qualifications, occupations, employment, unemployment, disability, disadvantage, volunteering, childcare, family structure, household structure, housing tenure, mortgage and rental payments, and the size and type of the dwellings people live in.

The Community Profile presents this information in clear maps, tables and charts with concise factual commentary to answer three important questions:

1. What are the characteristics of the people who live here?
2. How are they changing?
3. How do they compare to other areas?

This provides the basis for making evidence-based decisions about how to provide services for the community as it changes.
